The directors present their report and financial statements for the year ended 31 May 2009

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITY

The principal activity of the company is the design, manufacture and supply of computer software and the provision of associated professional and maintenance services

RESULTS AND DIVIDENDS

The financial highlights for the year were

- Revenues decreased by 16% to £5 9m (2008 £6 9 m)
- Operating profit was £0 5m (2008 £1 2m)
- Profit after tax of £587k (2008 £981k)
- Cash balance at the end of the year was £958k (2008 £729k)
- · Bank facilities renegotiated and extended during the year

The directors do not recommend the payment of any dividends (2008 £nil)

REVIEW OF THE BUSINESS AND FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS

Against a backdrop of turbulent economic conditions and in common with most organisations the company has faced a challenging year. Within our core markets companies have found trading conditions tough and this combined with the squeeze on credit has resulted in many companies postponing or scaling back IT projects and seeking to preserve cash. The impact of this has been that licence sales to both new and existing customers are lower than the previous year and account for the majority of the decline in revenue year on year.

During the year we took decisive action to offset the fall in revenue by reducing costs and making a limited number of redundancies. The steps taken ensured that the operating business remained profitable. In the year we generated over 50% of our income from recurring revenues and it is the predictability and security of this recurring revenue that enables us to continue investing in both enhancing our existing products and the development of new software.

During the year we also took the opportunity to renegotiate and extend our banking facilities on favourable terms and this, combined with the fact that our cash collections from customers have remained largely unaffected by the economic conditions has enabled us to strengthen the cash position of the Company and the Group

Although lower than the prior year the Company has continued to generate demand for the OneOffice software suite from both existing customers and new customers. We are continuing to invest in further enhancements to the OneOffice and Strategix software products and have also invested in extending the products in new areas. One of the key areas of development during the last year has been the creation of our new integrated web trading platform, OneOffice Connect Web. We have already secured our first customers for OneOffice Connect Web and expect to make further sales in the new financial year to existing customers who either need to upgrade their current online trading platform or wish to extend their current sales channels with an online trading platform.

TIS SOFTWARE LIMITED DIRECTORS' REPORT (CONTINUED) FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MAY 2009

Outlook

With no evidence at the start of the new financial year of an improvement in the economic climate or trading conditions the directors took the decision to further restructure the business to reduce costs, preserve cash and protect future investment in product development. This restructuring has been completed during the first half of the financial year and the directors are confident that the Company is now stronger and better positioned for the future. The directors are encouraged that with the current challenging trading conditions the Company has continued to sign new business and extend its sales to existing customers and the directors believe that when confidence returns to the economy the Company is well positioned to take advantage of the opportunities that will arise

The Directors view the remainder of the financial year to 31st May 2010 with confidence

BUSINESS RISKS

In common with other companies in the computer software sector, the Company may be impacted by external market factors beyond its reasonable control. These could include

- A further deterioration in the general economic environment or market conditions for business
 application software that restricts the Company's ability to close new business with the
 associated financial implications this could have. To mitigate this risk we seek to ensure that we
 maintain close and strategic relationships with our customers and in doing so minimise our
 reliance on new business sales.
- Advances in general technology and/or the capability of competitor products. To mitigate this risk
 we continue to invest in technology and application development.

1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

a) Basis of Preparation

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention

b) Cash Flow Statement

The directors have taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No 1 (revised) from including a cash flow statement in the financial statements on the grounds that the company is wholly owned and its parent publishes a consolidated cash flow statement

c) Related Parties Transactions

The company has taken advantage of the exemption in FRS 8 not to disclose transactions with other group companies

d) Fixed Assets

All fixed assets are initially recorded at cost

e) Depreciation

Depreciation is provided on all tangible fixed assets, other than freehold land, at rates calculated to write off the cost, less estimated residual value based on prices prevailing at the date of acquisition of each asset evenly over its expected useful life, as follows

Freehold Property - 2% per annum

Furniture, Fittings and Equipment - 10% - 33 33% per annum Motor Vehicles - 25% - 33 33% per annum

f) Stock

Stock is valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value

g) Research & Development

Research and development expenditure, including, the cost of software products developed inhouse, is expensed in the year in which it is incurred

h) Deferred Taxation

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date where transactions or events have occurred at that date that will result in an obligation to pay more, or a right to pay less or to receive more, tax, with the following exceptions

provision is made for tax on gains arising from the revaluation (and similar fair value adjustments) of fixed assets, and gains on disposal of fixed assets that have been rolled over into replacement assets, only to the extent that, at the balance sheet date, there is a binding agreement to dispose of the assets concerned. However, no provision is made where, on the basis of all available evidence at the balance sheet date, it is more likely than not that the taxable gain will be rolled over into replacement assets and charged to tax only where the replacement assets are sold,

1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

h) Deferred Taxation (continued)

 deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent that the directors consider that it is more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing difference can be deducted

Deferred tax is measured on an undiscounted basis at the tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which timing difference reverse, based on tax rates and laws enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date

i) Foreign Currencies

Assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies have been translated at the rate of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. Transactions completed during the accounting period are translated into Sterling at the rate of exchange ruling at the date of the transaction. All profits or losses on exchange are dealt with through the profit and loss account.

j) Operating Lease Agreements

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged in the profit and loss account on a straight line basis over the lease term. Any premium or discount on the acquisition of a lease is spread over the lease term.

k) Pension Costs

The Company operates a defined contribution pension scheme covering the majority of its employees. The costs of the pension scheme are charged in the profit and loss account as they fall due.

Outstanding contributions at the year end were £32,690 (2008 £25,949)

I) Group Financial Statements

Group financial statements have not been prepared as the company is exempt from preparing financial statements under s400 of the Companies Act 2006, on the basis that the company is a subsidiary of an EC parent company which prepares group financial statements. These financial statements present information about the company as an individual undertaking and not about its group.

2 TURNOVER

Turnover represents amounts invoiced to customers, net of VAT, for goods and services Revenues from systems are recognised upon delivery to a customer when there are no significant vendor obligations remaining and the collection of the resulting receivable is considered probable. In circumstances where a considerable vendor obligation exists, revenue recognition is delayed until the obligation has been satisfied. Service revenue comprises revenue for maintenance, transaction processing and professional services. Maintenance and support contracts are recognised rateably over the period of the contract. Electronic data interchange and remote processing services are recognised monthly as work is performed. Professional services, such as implementation, training and consultancy, are recognised when the services are performed.

Turnover is attributable to one continuing activity, the sale of software and supporting services
