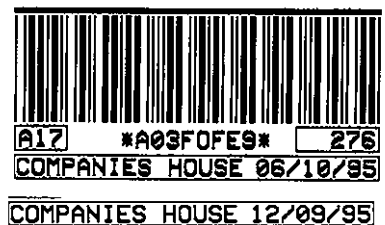

Respective Responsibilities of Directors and Reporting Accountants

These procedures provide only the assurance expressed in our opinion.

Opinion

In our opinion :

- (a) the accounts are in agreement with the accounting records kept by the company under section 221 of the Companies Act 1985 ;
- (b) having regard only to and on the basis of, the information contained in those accounting records:
 - (i) the accounts have been drawn up in a manner consistent with the accounting requirements specified in section 249C(6) of the Act; and
 - (ii) the company satisfied the conditions for exemption from an audit of the accounts for the year specified in section 249A(4) of the Act and did not, at any time within that year, fall within any of the categories of companies not entitled to the exemption specified in section 249B(1).
