The directors present their report and the financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2011

DIRECTORS' RESPONSIBILITIES STATEMENT

The policy of focusing on niche products and added value services has enabled the company to maintain respectable profitability, before one-off transactions, despite the loss of confidence and poor economic outlook in most sectors.

The directors feel that the results for the year are good, given the difficult trading conditions throughout the period. Relative to this, the company's key financial indicators are positive.

The outlook for 2012 is challenging, but it is felt the company's strong balance sheet and focus on supplying niche products puts it in a good position to benefit when trading conditions become more favourable

RESULTS AND DIVIDENDS

The profit for the year, after taxation, amounted to £144,714 (2010 - £95,561)

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1.1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards

12 Turnover

Turnover comprises revenue recognised by the company in respect of goods and services supplied during the year, exclusive of Value Added Tax and trade discounts

1.3 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost of fixed assets, less their estimated residual value, over their expected useful lives on the following annual bases.

Office equipment

25% reducing balance

Fixtures, fittings and equipment -

15% reducing balance

Computer equipment

33 3% straight line

14 Leasing and hire purchase

Assets obtained under hire purchase contracts and finance leases are capitalised as tangible fixed assets. Assets acquired by finance lease are depreciated over the shorter of the lease term and their useful lives. Assets acquired by hire purchase are depreciated over their useful lives. Finance leases are those where substantially all of the benefits and risks of ownership are assumed by the company. Obligations under such agreements are included in creditors net of the finance charge allocated to future periods. The finance element of the rental payment is charged to the Profit and loss account so as to produce a constant periodic rate of charge on the net obligation outstanding in each period.

1.5 Operating leases

Rentals under operating leases are charged to the Profit and loss account on a straight line basis over the lease term

Benefits received and receivable as an incentive to sign an operating lease are recognised on a straight line basis over the period until the date the rent is expected to be adjusted to the prevailing market rate

16 Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value after making due allowance for obsolete and slow-moving stocks

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

1.7 Deferred taxation

Full provision is made for deferred tax assets and liabilities arising from all timing differences between the recognition of gains and losses in the financial statements and recognition in the tax computation

A net deferred tax asset is recognised only if it can be regarded as more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are calculated at the tax rates expected to be effective at the time the timing differences are expected to reverse

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are not discounted

1.8 Foreign currencies

Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date

Transactions in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rate ruling on the date of the transaction

Exchange gains and losses are recognised in the Profit and loss account

19 Research and development

Research and development expenditure is written off in the year in which it is incurred

1 10 Pensions

The company makes contributions to money purchase contribution schemes for certain employees, the assets of the schemes being held separately from the assets of the company. The pension charge represents the amounts payable by the company to the funds in respect of the year.

2. TURNOVER

In the year 33% (2010 - 27%) of the company's turnover was attributable to sales to markets outside of the United Kingdom
