The Directors present their report and the financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2011

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES AND REVIEW OF BUSINESS

The principal activity of the Company, a subsidiary of Global Radio UK Limited (the Group), is unchanged from last year and is the operation in the Ipswich and Bury St Edmunds area of the independent radio licence for Heart 97 1 and 96 4

Turnover for the year ended 31 March 2011 amounted to £2,563,000 (2010 £2,885,000) and the Company made a profit for the year before tax of £189,000 (2010 £424,000)

Suffolk Group Radio Limited experienced fall in turnover due to a weak advertising market

RESULTS AND DIVIDENDS

The profit for the year, after taxation, amounted to £92,000 (2010 - £300,000)

There were no dividends paid or proposed during the year (2010 £nil)

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2011

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1.1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards

The Company is the parent undertaking of a small group and as such is not required by the Companies Act 2006 to prepare group accounts. These financial statements therefore present information about the Company as an individual undertaking and not about its group.

1.2 Cash flow

Under FRS 1 the Company is exempt from the requirement to prepare a cash flow statement on the grounds that a parent undertaking includes the Company in its own published consolidated financial statements

1.3 Turnover

Turnover comprises revenue recognised by the Company in respect of goods and services supplied, exclusive of Value Added Tax and trade discounts

Radio airtime revenue is recognised on the date of broadcast and this is considered to be the only material class of business for the Company in the United Kingdom

1.4 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost of fixed assets, less their estimated residual value, over their expected useful lives on the following bases.

Short-Term Leasehold Property - 20% - 33% straight-line per annum

1.5 Investments

Fixed asset investments are stated at cost less amounts written off

1.6 Deferred taxation

Full provision is made for deferred tax assets and liabilities arising from all timing differences between the recognition of gains and losses in the financial statements and recognition in the tax computation

A net deferred tax asset is recognised only if it can be regarded as more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are calculated at the tax rates expected to be effective at the time the timing differences are expected to reverse

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are not discounted

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2011

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

1.7 Going concern

The Company's business activities, together with the factors likely to affect its future development and position, are set out in the Business Review section of the Directors' Report on page 1. The Company participates in the group centralised treasury arrangements and so shares banking arrangements with its parent and fellow subsidiaries.

The Global Radio group has prepared detailed forecasts of expected future cash flows for the three years ending 31 March 2014 ("the forecast") The Board considers the forecast has been prepared on a prudent basis taking into account current consensus forecasts of the radio advertising market However, the group has also prepared a worse than expected downside scenario. Even under this sensitised scenario, the forecasts indicate that the Company can continue to trade for the foreseeable future and operate within its new facility and the associated financial covenants

2. TURNOVER

The whole of the turnover is attributable to the operation in the Ipswich and Bury St Edmunds area of the independent radio licence for Heart 97 1 and 96 4

All turnover arose within the United Kingdom

Global Radio Services Limited provided personnel and other services to the Company The amounts included in 'operating charges' contain a charge for these services of £589,986 (2010 £752,694)

Factors that may affect future tax charges

On 23 March 2011 the Chancellor announced the reduction in the main rate of UK corporation tax to 26 per cent with effect from 1 April 2011. This change became substantively enacted on 29 March 2011 and therefore the effect of the rate reduction creates a reduction in the deferred tax asset which has been included in the figures above. The Chancellor also proposed changes to further reduce the main rate of corporation tax by one per cent per annum to 23 per cent by 1 April 2014, but these changes have not yet been substantively enacted and therefore are not included in the figures above. The impact of the future rate reductions will be accounted for to the extent that they are enacted at the balance sheet date, however it is estimated that this will not have a material effect on the Company.
