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DIRECTORS' REPORT for the year ended 31 August 2012

The directors present their report and the financial statements for the year ended 31 August 2012

DIRECTORS' RESPONSIBILITIES STATEMENT

The directors are responsible for preparing the Directors' report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and regulations

Company law requires the directors to prepare financial statements for each financial year. Under that law the directors have elected to prepare the financial statements in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice (United Kingdom Accounting Standards and applicable law). Under company law the directors must not approve the financial statements unless they are satisfied that they give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the company and of the profit or loss of the company for that period. In preparing these financial statements, the directors are required to

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently,
- make judgments and accounting estimates that are reasonable and prudent,
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the company will continue in business

The directors are responsible for keeping adequate accounting records that are sufficient to show and explain the company's transactions and disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the company and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES & BUSINESS REVIEW

The Company ("ABD") continues to operate in the specialised area of design and manufacture of test equipment for vehicle suspension, steering, noise and vibration. We also offer a range of services which include analysis, design, prototype manufacture, test and development.

During the year we have delivered 3 Suspension Parameter Measurement Machines, one each to China, India and Taiwan. We have also received orders for 2 further machines which are under construction at the moment and will be delivered in the coming year.

Steering, brake and accelerator robots have continued to sell to customers in many parts of the world and we are building a further driverless soft crash target vehicle

We are working on the development of an alternative device, a Guided Soft Target which will be used for testing crash mitigation systems

The recent strong business growth has highlighted the need for additional factory/office space. Planning consent has been obtained for additional office accommodation which will be completed in the next 6 months. Plans are well advanced for the construction of a much larger facility, close by, to accommodate further growth.

ABD's business has been very successful in export markets. Over 90% of turnover has been exported. ABD's world class technology and high quality products are valued by the worldwide automotive industry.

The Board's perception of the potential of overseas markets has proved fully justified and it will maintain its policy of expansion in overseas markets. To assist the process we will continue to forge links with other organisations to support the Company's sales and technical efforts. The Board is optimistic that these arrangements will continue to prove beneficial in the coming year.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS for the year ended 31 August 2012

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1.1 BASIS OF PREPARATION OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards

1.2 GOING CONCERN

The company has cash resources and has no requirement for external funding. The directors have a reasonable expectation that the company has adequate resources to continue in operational existance for the foreseeable future. They continue to believe the going concern basis of accounting is appropriate in preparing the annual financial statements.

13 TURNOVER

Turnover comprises revenue recognised by the company in respect of goods and services supplied during the year, exclusive of Value Added Tax and trade discounts

1.4 TANGIBLE FIXED ASSETS AND DEPRECIATION

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost of fixed assets, less their estimated residual value, over their expected useful lives on the following bases.

Plant and machinery 10% straight line Motor vehicles 25% reducing balance Fixtures and fittings 10% straight line Computer equipment 25% straight line Bought out software 10-20% straight line In house software 33 3% straight line 10% straight line General equipment Proprietorial equipment 20% straight line 10-20% straight line Test equipment

15 STOCKS AND WORK IN PROGRESS

Stocks and work in progress are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value after making due allowance for obsolete and slow-moving stocks. Cost includes all direct costs and an appropriate proportion of fixed and variable overheads.

1.6 LONG-TERM CONTRACTS

Profit on long-term contracts is taken as the work is carried out if the final outcome can be assessed with reasonable certainty. The profit included is calculated on a prudent basis to reflect the proportion of the work carried out at the year end, by recording turnover and related costs as contract activity progresses. Turnover is calculated as that proportion of total contract value which costs incurred to date bear to total expected costs for that contract. Revenues derived from variations on contracts are recognised only when they have been accepted by the customer. Full provision is made for losses on all contracts in the year in which they are first foreseen.

Amounts recoverable on contracts, included within debtors, represents the amount by which recorded turnover is in excess of payments on account

ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

1.7 OPERATING LEASES

Rentals under operating leases are charged to the Profit and loss account on a straight line basis over the lease term

18 FOREIGN CURRENCIES

Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date

Transactions in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rate ruling on the date of the transaction

Exchange gains and losses are recognised in the Profit and loss account

1.9 RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT

Research and development expenditure is written off in the year in which it is incurred

1.10 DERIVATIVE FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS AND HEDGING ACTIVITY

The company uses derivative financial instruments to hedge its exposure to fluctuations in foreign exchange rates. The company has not adopted FRS 26 and therefore no fair value measurements are included in the financial statements. Gains and losses on foreign currency hedges are recognised in the profit and loss account on maturity of the underlying transaction. Gains or losses arising on hedging instruments which are cancelled due to the termination of underlying exposure are taken to the profit and loss account immediately.

1.11 DEFERRED TAXATION

Full provision is made for deferred tax assets and liabilities arising from all timing differences between the recognition of gains and losses in the financial statements and recognition in the tax computation

A net deferred tax asset is recognised only if it can be regarded as more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are calculated at the tax rates expected to be effective at the time the timing differences are expected to reverse

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are not discounted

1.12 PENSIONS

The company operated a defined benefits pension scheme On 23 November 2010 a Deed of Termination was signed by the Trustees of the pension scheme to wind up the assets of the scheme and all members were transferred out

In accordance with accounting standards, the company adopted the full requirements of FRS17 (Retirement Benefits) in respect of its defined benefit pension scheme

This adoption resulted in the company including the assets and liabilities of these arrangements in the company's balance sheet. Current service costs, curtailment and settlement gains and losses, and net financial returns are included in the profit and loss account in the period to which they relate Actuarial gains and losses are recognised in the statement of recognised gains and losses.

The company operates a defined contribution pension scheme and the pension charge represents the amounts payable by the company to the fund in respect of the year
