1 Introduction and Statutory Information

- I, Alan Bradstock FCA FCCA FABRP MIPA of AABRS Limited, Langley House, Park Road, London, N2 8EY, was appointed as Liquidator of 5 Star (Edible) Products Limited (the Company) on 11 March 2016. This report provides an update on the progress in the liquidation for year ended 10 March 2018 (the Period).
- 1.2 The trading address of the Company was Unit 2 Dolphin Way, Dolphin Park, Purfleet, Essex, RM19 1NZ.
- 1.3 The registered office of the Company was changed to Langley House, Park Road, East Finchley, London, N2 8EY and its registered number is 01700328.

2 Progress of the Liquidation

- 2.1 At Appendix A, I have provided an account of my Receipts and Payments for the Period, with a comparison to the Declaration of Solvency values together with a cumulative account since my appointment.
- 2.2 Below are details of the work that I have undertaken during the reporting period:-
 - (i) Preparing and issuing annual progress reports to members and creditors
 - (ii) Lodging periodic return to the Registrar of Companies for the liquidation
 - (iii) Update of case files on firm's insolvency software
 - (iv) Periodic case progression reviews
 - Maintaining and managing the liquidation estate cash book and bank account
 - (vi) Dealing with all post-appointment VAT and corporation tax compliance
- 2.3 Based on the current position of the case, the remaining work which is to be completed before a final meeting of the members is convened is the following:-
 - (i) Establishing whether there will be any realisations from the Option agreement which formed part of the consideration for the sale of the freehold property
 - (ii) Dealing with the payment of the outstanding Corporation tax liabilities.

Realisation of Assets

2.4 Repayment under Indemnity

(i) As a result of the fact that the administration of this matter has been far more complex than originally anticipated, the sum of £77,400 was requested from the shareholders as repayment of the distribution made to them at the outset of the Liquidation.

2.5 Book Debts

(i) The director's Declaration of Solvency made no provision for book debts. However, £19,268.87 was recovered from the bank being credits to the account following the Liquidation.

2.6 ANY OTHER ASSETS

- 2.7 The Company entered into an Overage agreement as part of the sale of the freehold property. Discussions with the developer are ongoing, it is uncertain whether any realisations will be made. However, if there are further realisations in this matter there will be tax implications as referenced in Section 3.5 of this report.
- 2.8 Based on the above information, I currently anticipate the total expenses that may be incurred in dealing with the remainder of the Company's asset realisation to be £5,000. However, my fees in this matter are fixed.

3 Creditors' Claims

Secured Creditors

3.1 There are no outstanding charges to secured creditors registered at Companies House. All charges registered at Companies House have been satisfied.

Preferential Creditors

3.2 No claims were anticipated and none have been received.

Unsecured Creditors

- 3.3 I have received claims totalling £2,806,355.84 from eleven creditors. The Directors have made a Declaration of Solvency to the effect that all of the Company's debts will be paid in full, together with statutory interest, within 12 months of the commencement of the Liquidation.
- 3.4 Due to the complexity of the affairs of the Company further representations and returns were to be submitted to HMRC to ascertain the final tax liabilities. Based on the position as it is currently understood there is a further Corporation tax liability of £18,455.08 to be paid. This will be discharged shortly.
- 3.5 As part of the sale of a freehold property the Company entered into an Overage agreement. If there are any realisations from this source, there may be a further tax liability which will be dealt with in due course.

4 Distributions to Members

- 4.1 The following cash distributions to members have been made since the date of my appointment:
 - An interim dividend of £1,003.78 per ordinary share on 14 March 2016 totalling £10,036,833.39.



5 Liquidator's Remuneration

- 5.1 The members approved that the basis of the Liquidator's remuneration be £65,000 plus VAT and disbursements. In addition, pre-appointment fees were agreed at £15,000 plus VAT and disbursements. This shall be drawn on the basis of the time properly spent by liquidator and his staff in managing the Liquidation.
- 5.2 I would confirm that £65,000 plus disbursements of £1,611 has been drawn to date on account of these costs.
- 5.3 Attached as Appendix B is additional information in relation to the Liquidator's fees.

6 Liquidator's Expenses and Disbursements

11 Liquidator's Disbursements
