ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Turnover

1

Turnover represents net invoiced sales of goods, excluding value added tax.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Freehold land and building not depreciated
Plant and machinery 25% reducing balance
Fixtures and fittings 15% reducing balance
Motor Vehicles 25% reducing balance

As the property maintains a residual disposal value on prices prevailing at least equal to its book value, no depreciation has been provided on freehold buildings as the directors consider the charge to be immaterial.

Stocks

Stock and work in progress are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Deferred tax

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date.

Hire purchase and leasing commitments

Assets obtained under hire purchase contracts or finance leases are capitalised in the balance sheet and depreciated using the above rates.

The interest element of these obligations is charged to the profit and loss account over the period of the contract or lease. The capital element of the future payments is treated as a liability.

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to the profit and loss account as incurred.

Pensions

The company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. The assets of the scheme are held separately from those of the company in an independently administered fund. Contributions payable for the year are charged in the profit and loss account.

Retentions

It is the company's policy to absorb the cost of remedial work arising on contracts in the year in which they are incurred.
