Joint Liquidators' Actions During The Period

During the Liquidation I have realised the following company assets:

Cash at Bank

The Declaration of Solvency estimated the sum of £78,704.84 was held in the Company's bank account. Following my appointment, a total sum of £50,474.99 was received.

Bank Interest

During the liquidation the sum of £3.38 has been received in interest.

Unsecured Creditors

HM Revenue & Customs were not identified as a Creditor on the Declaration of Solvency and a refund was actually expected in respect of other taxes. There was also Corporation Tax Liability outstanding before the Company entered Liquidation and the director had settled this liability prior to the liquidation. However, HM Revenue & Customs returned the funds to the Liquidators and they were distributed, in error, to the shareholders. HM Revenue & Customs subsequently lodged a claim for the Corporation Tax less the refund that was due. Funds were returned to the state by the shareholder to settle the outstanding liability of £3,712.74 and the capital distribution has been re-stated.

Directors Loan Account

At the date of the liquidation the director owed the Company £9,203.97. As the director is also the shareholder, therefore rather than collecting this debt it was distributed in specie back to the director/shareholder.

Total Assets

In total assets totalling £55,836.57 have been realised.

Receipts & Payments

As reported above I have reduced my fees from £2,500 to £1,750 plus VAT which resulted in £150 in VAT being over-recovered. The Liquidators have repaid this amount to HM Revenue & Customs from their office account.

Distributions to Members

Distributions have been made to members in the form of cash and by way of an assignment of assets, known as a distribution in specie. Details of the distributions to each shareholder are as follows:
