#### TRUSTEES ANNUAL REPORT

For the year ended 31 March 2015

The trustees, who are also directors for the purposes of the Companies Act, present their report and the unaudited financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2015.

#### LEGAL STATUS

Throckley Community Hall Limited is a registered charity governed by its memorandum and articles of association. The company is limited by guarantee and is a registered charity, number 519477. Company number 01862258.

#### OBJECTIVES OF THROCKLEY COMMUNTIY HALL

The principle activity of the company is to provide accommodation facilities for activities of the inhabitants of Throckley and the areas adjacent to the Village. Activities include education, leisure and sporting pursuits, there are also events relating to welfare and general benefits for the population. The Hall is managed by a Management Group who are seeking to ever widen the usage of the facilities.

#### **ORGANISATION**

The trustees who have served during the year and since the year end are set out below. Trustees are appointed at the A.G.M. and serve for the year in question after which they may put themselves forward for re-appointment.

#### REVIEW OF DEVELOPMENTS, ACTIVITIES AND ACHIEVEMENTS

The Association is still going strong with lots of support from the Community of Newburn Ward. This year we have started 2 new groups:-

<u>Crafty Club</u> – This little group was formed through us receiving a grant from "Staying Connected" (The Elders Council of Newcastle) which helped us to buy material. Although just a few people (approx. 7) have joined this group, they are very keen and have produced some excellent articles.

<u>The Hub</u> – This is for children aged 5 plus to enhance their literacy and numerical skills, about 12-15 children attend on a regular basis, parents are encouraged to stay with their children so the parents are learning new skills as well as the children.

Our regular groups are still being well attended and increasing in popularity.

<u>Ukulele group</u> – Now have 20 + members and entertain the community by playing at several Care Homes, our local Church and at Elders Council AGM.

<u>Youth Club</u> – The past year our Young people have catered for our local Councillors/Committee by preparing a meal based upon a Portuguese theme in conjunction with the 2014 World Cup Final. They also once again worked with The Sage Gateshead doing a DJ project.

Both these activities were made available by "Staying Connected" grants through the Elders Council.

Party bookings have once again picked up, but we have still been concentrating on fundraising.

Once again our volunteers obtained bulbs from Dobby's Garden Centre, which makes the entrance to our building rather attractive, as we have no other flower displays in Throckley.

We received a cheque from Sainsbury's, our local supermarket, for £1,000 as we have been their Charity of the Year for 2013/2014.

As Trustees and Committee members we are all pleased that we achieved all our goals for 2013/2014.

Our goals for this financial year are:-

- 1. Painting the outside of our Community Hall
- 2. Main Hall floor to be stripped and varnished
- 3. 1 hand drier to be installed in the only toilet without a one
- 4. We desperately need new blinds and the Committee agreed to change from venetian blinds to blackout roller blinds
- 5. Replacing the entrance door/s to the Main Hall
- 6. More effective radiators throughout the building

As Trustees we do our best to promote our hall to the community of Newburn Ward, also the wider community by posters in local shops and neighbourhood notice boards, etc. A new group has been started in our Village and we are involved with them, Throckley Action Group (TAGon) which is a Facebook page and anyone can advertise their events etc.

Once again we have been very lucky that Sainsbury's have chosen Throckley Community Hall as their local charity for the financial year 2015/16.

We still help other Charities; Marie Curie, St Oswald's Hospice and Macmillan.

Trustees and the Management Committee would like to thank our local Councillors, Northumbria Police, local Community Support Officers, Northumberland Clubs for Young People and Council Officers for their continued support, but, a very big thank you to all our volunteers whom we could not do without. THANK YOU.

#### INVESTMENT POWERS AND RESTRICTIONS

The management committee have the power to invest in such investments as they see fit, subject to any restrictions imposed by law.

To this end the charity have held monies in reserve in a high interest deposit account.

#### RESERVES POLICY

The charity holds minimal reserves other than that needed for proposed refurbishment of the premises.

#### RISK MANAGEMENT

During the year the trustees carried out a detailed review of the charity's activities and produced a comprehensive plan identifying the major risks to which the charity is exposed. As part of the risk management process, the trustees have implemented a risk management strategy which comprises:

- \* an annual review of the risks which the charity may face;
- detailed action plans to mitigate those risks identified;
- \* the implementation of procedures designed to minimise any potential impact on the charity should any of those risks materialise.

The risk management focused on the need to ensure new developments in the Throckley area are kept abreast of and initiate compliance measures as and when appropriate.

#### 1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### **BASIS OF ACCOUNTING**

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" (SORP 2005) issued in March 2005 and the Companies Act 2006.

#### CASH FLOW STATEMENT

The trustees have taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No 1 (revised) from including a cash flow statement in the financial statements on the grounds that the charity is small.

#### **INCOMING RESOURCES**

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when the charity is entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income:

- Voluntary income is received by way of grants and donations and is included in full in the statement of financial activities when receivable. Grants, where entitlement is not conditional on delivery of a specific performance by the charity, are recognised when the charity becomes unconditionally entitled to the grant.
- Investment income is included when receivable.
- Rental income is recorded when it is receivable.
- Incoming resources from grants, where related to performance and specific deliverables, are accounted for as the charity earns the right to consideration by its performance.

Income received by way of donation or grant for the purchase of a fixed asset is credited to the restricted funds in the Statement of Financial Activities when receivable. Depreciation on the fixed assets purchased with these funds is charged against the restricted fund.

#### **FUNDS ACCOUNTING**

Funds held by the charity are either:

- Unrestricted general funds
  - These are funds which can be used in accordance with the charitable objects at the discretion of the trustees.
- Designated funds
  - These are funds set aside by the trustees out of unrestricted general funds for specific future purposes or projects.
- Restricted funds
  - These are funds that can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

#### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

#### 1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

#### RESOURCES EXPENDED

Expenditure is recognised on an accruals basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT and is reported as part of the expenditure to which it relates:

- Costs of generating voluntary income funds comprise the costs associated with attracting voluntary income.
- Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.
- Governance costs include those costs associated with the meeting the constitutional and statutory
  requirements of the charity and include accountancy fees and costs linked to the strategic
  management of the charity.
- All costs are allocated between the expenditure categories of the SofA on a basis designed to reflect the use of the resource. Costs relating to a particular activity are allocated directly, others are apportioned based on staff time across project work, generating funds and governance.

#### **FIXED ASSETS**

Tangible fixed assets costing £50 or more are capitalised and included at cost including any incidental expenses of acquisition.

Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost of an asset, less its estimated residual value, over the useful economic life of that asset as follows:

Land and buildings - 5% straight line
Plant and machinery - 25% reducing balance

The Gym mats fund relates to grant received to purchase gym mats for the hall.

The signage fund was a grant received to purchase new notice boards and is to be depreciated by 25% reducing balance.

The youth club fund was received to pay for the hiring of the hall.

The boiler fund was a grant received to purchase a new boiler for the hall and is to be depreciated by 5% straight line.
