## Directors' Report for the year ended 31 December 1996

#### Directors responsibilies

Company law requires the directors to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the company and of the profit or loss of the company for that period. In preparing those financial statements, the directors are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;

#### **Auditors**

In accordance with Section 385 of the Companies Act 1985, a resolution proposing that Haines Watts be reappointed as auditors of the company will be put to the Annual General Meeting.

#### 1. Accounting Policies

#### 1.1 Accounting convention

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention and include the results of the company's operations as indicated in the directors' report, all of which are continuing.

The company has taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No 1 from the requirement to produce a cashflow statement on the grounds that it is a small company.

#### 1.2 Turnover

Turnover represents amounts receivable for goods and services provided in the UK net of VAT and trade discounts.

#### 1.3 Capital expenditure

It is the policy of the company that purchases of a capital nature are not capitalised, but written off in the income and expenditure account in full in the year of purchase.

There were no such purchases in the year.

#### 1.4 Leasing

Rentals payable under operating leases are charged against income on a straight line basis over the lease term.

# 1.5 Investments

Current asset investments are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

#### 1.6 Pensions

The company operates a defined contribution pension scheme and the pension charge represents the amounts payable by the company to the fund in respect of the year.
