As a board, we would like to wind up the organisation transferring its significant assets to Royal Mencap Society, confident that our work will continue. The process will be carried out in the 2014/15 financial year.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank my colleagues for all their hard work and wise advice over the years.

In drawing to an end the operation of the charity, we will follow the requirements of company and charity law together with guidance issued by the Charity Commission.

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Trustees' report for the year ended 31 March 2014

The trustees of the AdCare Foundation Limited submit their annual report and the audited financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2014.

Objects and activities

The principal objectives of the Foundation are to undertake or to assist in or support the relief, treatment, comfort or care of persons suffering from mental infirmity, disease or disorder and who by reason of such infirmity, disease or disorder are in need of the same.

The principal activity during the year was the awarding of grants to support people with learning disabilities.

Public Benefit Statement

The trustees confirm that they have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the charity's aim and objectives and in planning the future activities and setting the grant making policy.

Financial report for the year

The net movement in funds for the year was an increase of £111,129 (2013: £209,504 decrease).

Grant making policies

The trustees have set policies in respect of grant making, with monies being available for the provision of leisure activities in the community, such that groups, clubs and individuals are supported to get the most from their leisure time.

Reserves

The trustees have reviewed the reserves of the charity and have agreed that their long-term aim is to run down reserves in order that beneficiaries receive the benefit of accumulated reserves.

Risks

The trustees confirm that the major risks to which the charity is exposed, as identified by the trustees, have been reviewed and systems have been established to mitigate those risks. The process of identifying these risks has been documented in the trustees' report for the Royal Mencap Society.

Future prospects

We have decided to merge AdCare into Royal Mencap Society. We will still provide the activities but this will cut down on the administration and overhead costs. This process will be completed in 2014-15.

Investments

During the year, investments were disposed of in their entirety. The market valuation prior to their disposal decreased by £17,633 (2013: £57,038 increase).

Related parties

AdCare Foundation is a wholly owned subsidiary of the Royal Mencap Society. The trustees consider the related parties to be Royal Mencap Society and its other subsidiary companies. The accounts of the parent company can be obtained from the head office at 123 Golden Lane, London EC1Y 0RT.

Statement of trustees' responsibilities

The Trustees are responsible for preparing the Trustees' Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and regulations.

Company law requires the Trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice (United Kingdom Accounting Standards) and applicable law.

Under company law the Trustees must not approve the financial statements unless they are satisfied that they give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charitable company and of its net incoming / outgoing resources for that period. In preparing these financial statements, the Trustees are required to:

- observe the methods and principles in the Charities SORP;
- make judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charitable company will continue to operate.

The Trustees are responsible for keeping adequate accounting records that are sufficient to show and explain the charitable company's transactions and disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charitable company and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006, the Charity (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008 and the provisions of the charitable company's constitution. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charitable company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities

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1. Accounting policies

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with the Companies Act 2006, the Statement of Recommended Practice "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" issued in March 2005 and applicable United Kingdom accounting standards. The particular accounting policies adopted by the trustees are described below.

Accounting convention

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention as modified by the revaluation of investments.

Incoming resources

All income is recognised in the statement of financial activities when the conditions for receipt have been met and there is reasonable assurance of receipt. The following accounting policies are applied to income:

Investment income

Investment income is accounted for when receivable and includes the related tax recoverable.

Legacies

Material legacies receivable at the yearend are included at their probate value. Legacies received in the form of property or investments are accounted for at the lower of probate or market value.

Charitable expenditure

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them. Included within charitable expenditure is the following:

Grants payable

Grants payable are accounted for when the trustees have accepted a legal or constructive obligation to make the grant.

Governance costs

These costs comprise the costs associated with the governance arrangements of the charity as opposed to those costs associated with fundraising or charitable activities. These include external audit costs and trustee costs.

Fund accounting

The charity's funds consist of general unrestricted funds representing funds which are expendable at the discretion of the trustees in the furtherance of the objects of the charity. Such funds may be held in order to finance both working capital and capital investment.

Investments

Investments are stated at market value. Realised and unrealised gains and losses are shown separately in the appropriate section of the statement of financial activities.

10. Expenses of the Trustees
