DIRECTORS' REPORT

The directors submit their annual report and the audited financial statements of the Company for the year ended 31st December 1993.

Directors

The directors of the Company at the date of the report are shown on page 3.

Directors' responsibilities

Company law requires the directors to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the Company and of the loss for that year. In preparing those financial statements, the directors are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable accounting standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the Company will continue in business.

The directors are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the Company and to enable them to ensure the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 1985. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Principal activity and review of the business

The principal activity of the Company continued to be that of holding company to a group of companies engaged in the supply of packaging materials, industrial and marine tape suppliers and converters and the production and supply of self adhesive insulation hangers.

There has been no significant change in the nature or volume of business during the year.

Results and dividends

The Company made a loss on ordinary activities before taxation for the year of £10,984 . The retained loss for the year deducted from reserves was £6,904 .

The directors do not recommend that a dividend be paid on the ordinary share capital of the Company.

Basis of opinion

It also includes an assessment of the significant estimates and judgements made by the directors in the preparation of the financial statements, and whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the Company's circumstances, consistently applied and adequately disclosed.

1 Accounting policies

The principal accounting policies used in the preparation of these accounts are set out below:

Basis of accounting

These accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention and are prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards.

The Company has taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Statement No. 1 from producing a Cash Flow Statement.

Fixed asset investment

Other unlisted investments are stated at cost.

Depreciation

Depreciation is provided on all tangible fixed assets at rates calculated to write off the cost, less estimated residual value, of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:

Land and buildings

- over 50 years

Basis of non consolidation

The results and assets and liabilities of Pakex Limited, Admiral Industrial Tape Converters Limited, Thermal Insulation Supplies Limited and PSP Marine Tapes Limited have not been consolidated but are accounted for on a dividends received basis by virtue of the exemption confirmed by section 248 of the Companies Act 1985 (as amended by the Companies Act 1989) in that the company and its subsidiary undertakings qualify as a medium sized group.

Interest payable

Interest payable is charged in the profit and loss account in the year in which it is incurred.

Deferred taxation

No provision has been made for deferred taxation, as in the opinion of the directors, all material timing differences are not expected to reverse in the foreseeable future.

Group relief

Group relief for corporation tax purposes is valued at an amount equal to the related tax saving. The payment equal to the tax saving is included as part of the overall taxation charge.
