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DIRECTORS' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2018

The directors present their report and the financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2018.

Review of year

The company is a member of the Reconnaissance Ventures Limited Group (RVLG). A full review of the Group's activities is contained in the Strategic Report of the RVLG financial statements.

The company is engaged in the provision of aircraft repair and maintenance. All services are performed for other members of the RVL Group.

Directors' responsibilities statement

The directors are responsible for preparing the directors' report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and regulations.

Company law requires the directors to prepare financial statements for each financial year. NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2018

1. Accounting policies

1.1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

RVL Airtech Limited (the company) is a limited liability company incorporated and domiciled in the United Kingdom. The address of its registered office is disclosed on the company information page.

The financial statements are produced in Sterling (£), which is the functional currency of the company. The financial statements are for the year ended 31 December 2018 (2017: year ended 31 December 2017).

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis under the historical cost convention and in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard (FRS) 102, the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland, including section 1A of FRS 102, and the Companies Act 2006.

The group, of which the company is a part, has incurred a loss before tax for the year of £2,517,480 (2017: £1,290,257) as it completed flight testing for the major Research and Development project on which it has been working since 2014. Both the losses and the development project have to date been funded by a mixture of bank loans and loans from the group's principal investor Business Growth Fund plc ("BGF"). Both remained supportive of the business and BGF provided a further £250,000 during 2018 to assist the project to conclusion. The bank funding has in 2018 been repaid in full and repayments have started to be made on the BGF funding. The project received certification from EASA, the European regulator, in August 2018, having already received approval from the FAA in the United States earlier in the year. Following the introduction into service of the first system with the UK MCA, which is expected to take place early in 2019, we will have a reference site to support increased levels of marketing which are expected to develop further interest already expressed by a number of global customers. Combined with a number of opportunities for the core business which are also under discussion, the directors believe that this puts the group and its subsidiaries onto a firm footing for growth and that it is appropriate for the financial statements of the group and its individual subsidiaries to be prepared on a going concern basis.

The following accounting policies have been applied:

1.2 Disclosure exemptions

The company has adopted the following disclosure exemptions:

As the company is a wholly owned subsidiary of a company whose consolidated accounts include the results of the subsidiary and are publicly available, the company has taken advantage of the FRS 102 section 1A exemption from disclosing transactions with group undertakings.

1.3 Turnover

Turnover is recognised to the extent that it is probable that economic benefits will flow to the company and the revenue can be reliably measured. Turnover is measured as the fair value of the consideration received or receivable, excluding discounts, value added tax and other sales taxes.

Turnover is recognised on goods and services when earned.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2018

Accounting policies (continued)

1.4 Tangible fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets under the cost model are stated at historical cost less accumulated depreciation and any accumulated impairment losses. Historical cost includes expenditure that is directly attributable to bringing the asset to the location and condition necessary for it to be capable of operating in the manner intended by management.

The company adds to the carrying amount of an item of fixed assets the cost of replacing part of such an item when that cost is incurred, if the replacement part is expected to provide incremental future benefits to the company. The carrying amount of the replaced part is derecognised. Repairs and maintenance are charged to the profit and loss account during the period in which they are incurred.

Depreciation is charged so as to allocate the cost of assets less their residual value over their estimated useful lives, using the straight-line method.

Depreciation is provided on the following basis:

Leasehold property - 4% - 25% straight line
Plant and machinery - 20% straight line
Motor vehicles - 20% straight line
Fixtures and fittings - 20% straight line

The assets' residual values, useful lives and depreciation methods are reviewed, and adjusted prospectively if appropriate, or if there is an indication of a significant change since the last reporting date.

Gains and losses on disposals are determined by comparing the proceeds with the carrying amount and are recognised in the profit and loss account.

1.5 Stocks

Stocks are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value, being the estimated selling price less costs to complete and sell. Cost is based on the cost of purchase on a first in, first out basis.

At each balance sheet date, stocks are assessed for impairment. If stock is impaired, the carrying amount is reduced to its selling price less costs to complete and sell. The impairment loss is recognised immediately in the profit and loss account.

1.6 Financial instruments

The company only enters into basic financial instruments transactions that result in the recognition of financial assets and liabilities like trade and other debtors and creditors, loans from banks and other third parties and trading and loan balances with related parties.

All financial assets and liabilities are initially measured at transaction price and subsequently measured at amortised cost.

For financial assets measured at cost less impairment, the impairment loss is measured as the difference between an asset's carrying amount and best estimate, which is an approximation of the amount that the company would receive for the asset if it were to be sold at the balance sheet date.

1. Accounting policies (continued)

1.7 Foreign currency translation

Functional and presentation currency

The company's functional and presentational currency is Sterling (£).

Transactions and balances

Foreign currency transactions are translated into the functional currency using the spot exchange rates at the dates of the transactions.

At each period end foreign currency monetary items are translated using the closing rate. Non-monetary items measured at historical cost are translated using the exchange rate at the date of the transaction and non-monetary items measured at fair value are measured using the exchange rate when fair value was determined.

1.8 Finance costs

Finance costs are charged to the profit and loss account over the term of the debt using the effective interest method so that the amount charged is at a constant rate on the carrying amount. Issue costs are initially recognised as a reduction in the proceeds of the associated capital instrument.

1.9 Pensions

The company operates a defined contribution plan for its employees. A defined contribution plan is a pension plan under which the company pays fixed contributions into a separate entity. Once the contributions have been paid the company has no further payments obligations.

The contributions are recognised as an expense in the profit and loss account when they fall due. Amounts not paid are shown in accruals as a liability in the balance sheet. The assets of the plan are held separately from the company in independently administered funds.

1.10 Operating leases

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to the profit and loss account on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.

1.11 Interest income

Interest income is recognised in the profit and loss account using the effective interest method.

1. Accounting policies (continued)

1.12 Taxation

Tax is recognised in the profit and loss account, except that a change attributable to an item of income and expense recognised as other comprehensive income or to an item recognised directly in equity is also recognised in other comprehensive income or directly in equity respectively.

The current income tax charge is calculated on the basis of tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date in the countries where the company operates and generates income.

Deferred tax balances are recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed by the balance sheet date, except that:

- The recognition of deferred tax assets is limited to the extent that it is probable that they will be recovered against the reversal of deferred tax liabilities or other future taxable profits; and
- Any deferred tax balances are reversed if and when all conditions for retaining the associated tax allowances have been met.

2. Average number of employees

The average number of employees for the year, including directors, was 24 (2017: 24).
