Accounting convention

The financial statements are prepared on the going concern basis, under the historical cost convention

Turnover

Turnover represents the net amounts receivable from the parent undertaking for services rendered in the ordinary course of business during the financial year

Operating leases

Costs in respect of operating leases are charged as incurred over the lease term

Dividends

Interim dividends are recognised in the accounting period in which they are paid. Final dividends are recognised as a liability in the accounting period in which they are approved.

Cash flow statement

The company is a wholly-owned subsidiary of S. Norton and Co Ltd and is included in the consolidated financial statements, which are publicly available. Consequently, the company has taken advantage of the exemption from preparing a cash flow statement under the terms of FRS 1 (revised 1996). The company is also exempt under the terms of FRS 8 from disclosing related-party transactions with entities that are part of the S. Norton and Co Ltd group or the group's investees.

Related party transactions

The company has taken advantage of the exemption available under FRS8 not to disclose transactions with its parent undertaking
