Chairman's Statement

In September 1997, in accordance with the terms of our loan agreement with 3i plc, the company increased the level of repayments on the loan from £ 13,750 per quarter to £ 55, 000 per quarter.

The object of this exercise was to redeem the vastly over secured loan as early as possible in order to be able to renegotiate a larger advance to finance the debt which three years of high investment in our facilities had created.

The result on our year end Balance Sheet was to reclassify the loan balance at 31st March 1998 from long term to short term, with a corresponding increase in current liabilities and reduction in long term liabilities at that date.

In August 1998 the new loan of £ 600,000 was agreed with Nat. West Bank. A final payment of £ 140,000 was made to 3i at this time. The new loan is scheduled to run over a ten year period, with quarterly repayments of £ 15,000.

The remaining £ 460, 000 of the new loan has been absorbed into the company's working capital, clearing our overdraft and reducing the level of borrowing on our invoice discounting facility significantly. This has corrected the temporary swing to higher current liabilities and re-established the balance of our financing.

DIRECTORS' REPORT

The directors submit their report and the annual accounts for the year ended 31st March 1998.

Company law requires the directors to prepare accounts that give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the company and of the group and of the profit or loss of the group for the financial year. In doing so the directors are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and apply them consistently
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent

The directors are responsible for maintaining proper accounting records that disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the company and the group and to enable them to ensure that the accounts comply with the Companies Act 1985. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the company and the group and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES AND BUSINESS REVIEW

The principal activities of the group during the year were the importation and broking of speciality foods and the manufacture and sale of pate.

The directors consider the group's financial position at the end of the year to be satisfactory.

DIVIDENDS AND APPROPRIATIONS

A dividend of £4,689 was paid on the 'A' ordinary shares. Dividends of £14,577 and £16,417 are proposed on the 'A' ordinary and ordinary shares respectively. The directors do not recommend further dividends for the year.

MARKET VALUE OF LAND AND BUILDINGS

The directors are of the opinion that the current open market value of the group's freehold and leasehold land and buildings, with the benefit of vacant possession for continuation of the existing use, is not significantly different from their book value.

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS

ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with applicable accounting standards.

Basis of consolidation

The consolidated accounts include the results of Charcuterie Foods Limited and its subsidiary undertakings for the year ended 31st March 1998.

No profit and loss account is presented for the company as provided for by Section 230(4) of the Companies Act 1985.

Turnover

Turnover consists of sales to third parties, net of value added tax and trade discounts.

Depreciation of intangible fixed assets

Goodwill arising on consolidation is being depreciated over a period of twenty years. This period is considered by the directors to be the useful economic life.

Depreciation of tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided on all tangible fixed assets (other than freehold property) so as to write them off over their anticipated useful lives at the following annual rates on a straight line basis:

Long leasehold property - 1.5%

Short leasehold property - over the length of the lease

Fixtures and fittings - 10%
Computers, plant and machinery - 10%
Motor vehicles - 25%

Freehold property is not depreciated. Properties are maintained to ensure that their value does not diminish over time. The maintenance costs are charged to the profit and loss account in the year incurred. In the opinion of the directors, depreciation would be immaterial and has not been charged.

Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Foreign currencies

Assets and liabilities expressed in foreign currencies are translated at the rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. Transactions in foreign currencies are translated at the rate ruling at the date of the transaction. Differences arising are dealt with in the profit and loss account.



NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS (continued)

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

Invoice discounting

The group has a facility whereby it can draw up to 80% of the value of trade debtors. Repsonsibility for invoicing and collection remains with the group and the loan is repaid out of the proceeds of settlement by debtors or on debts becoming uncollectable.

Trade debtors are disclosed at the amounts collectable from third parties. Advances made under the facility are disclosed within creditors due within one year.

Leasing and hire purchase contracts

Assets being acquired under finance leases and hire purchase contracts are capitalised in the balance sheet and are depreciated over their anticipated useful lives. The obligation to make future rental payments, net of future finance charges, is recognised as a liability in the balance sheet. The interest element of the lease and hire purchase payments are charged to the profit and loss account at a constant rate over the period of the agreement.

Rentals under operating leases are charged to the profit and loss account as incurred.

Deferred taxation

Deferred taxation is calculated using the liability method and provision is made to the extent that it is probable that such tax will become payable in the foreseeable future.

Pension costs

Retirement benefits to employees are provided by defined contribution schemes which are funded by contributions from the group and employees.

Payments are made to insurance companies and are charged to the profit and loss account for the year in which they become payable.
