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#### REPORT OF THE COUNCIL OF MANAGEMENT

The Councillors have pleasure in submitting their annual report and financial statements for the year ended 24th June 2002.

#### ACTIVITIES

The company manages the property at St. Paul's Place and acts as the intermediate landlord between the property's freeholder, Winchester Land PLC, and the individual residents.

#### REVIEW OF THE YEAR

The deficit for the year amounted to £49 (2000 - surplus £1,380). The deficit has been arrived at after charging £1,000 provision in respect of the required triennial external decorating of St. Paul's Place, which was last undertaken in May 2001. This amount represents a third of the estimated cost that will need to be expended in 2004.

#### INCOME AND EXPENDITURE

Revenue details for the year are shown in the income and expenditure account on page 3. No distribution of part of the Management Fund is proposed.
