#### NOTE TO THE ACCOUNTS - 24TH JUNE 1999

#### ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### Basis of Preparation

The accounts have been prepared under the historic cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective March 1999).

#### External Decorating

Under the terms of the Headlease between the freeholder and the company, the company is required to redecorate the exterior of St. Paul's Place every three years. The cost of each redecoration is charged to the Income and Expenditure Account over three years, commencing with the year following the last redecoration.

#### STATEMENT OF COUNCILLORS' RESPONSIBILITIES

The Companies Act 1985 requires the councillors to prepare financial statements for the company each year. In preparing the financial statements the councillors are required to:

- 1. select suitable accounting policies which are applied consistently;
- 2. make judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and
- 3. follow applicable accounting standards, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements.

The councillors are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the company and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 1985. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the company and hence for taking steps to prevent and detect fraud and other irregularities.
