STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

CONSTITUTION

T.O.F.S is a charity which was also established as a Company Limited By Guarantee And Not Having A Share Capital on October 20th, 1987. Its Articles of Association describes its constitution; its Memorandum of Association summarises its objects as relieving in cases of needy children and young persons suffering from tracheo oesophageal fistula, oesophageal atresia and oesophageal and related disorders including the vater association.

ORGANISATIONAL STRUCTURE

The overall direction and management of TOFS is overseen by the Trustees who form the Council of Management (C.O.M.), and who are also Directors of the Company. This Council is accountable and legally responsible for the work of the organization and for ensuring that all aspects of the management and work comply with current legislation. The Council is supported by administrative staff headed by the Office Manager, and by volunteers.

POLICIES AND DOCUMENTATION

Appropriate policies and procedures are in place to support the effective operation of TOFS. These include, but are not limited to: Health & Safety, Protection of vulnerable children, Financial management, Personnel, Guidance & Training, IT & Data Protection, and Communications.

RISK MANAGEMENT

The Trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the charity is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud or error.

Risks are reviewed and mitigated by:

- · An organizational commitment to standards of good management and operational practice
- Established policies which commit to compliance with all relevant legislation and good practice
- · Regular review of all policies and procedures
- Through establishing adequate financial reserves

RECRUITMENT AND APPOINTMENT OF TRUSTEES

TOFS welcomes eligible people who have an interest in helping the organization achieve its objectives by becoming a Trustee. Whilst the majority of TOFS members are parents or grandparents of TOFS children, TOFS welcomes potential trustees from all walks of life.

The Articles of Association state the eligibility of Trustees, which, in summary, state that those eligible must:

- be over the age of 18
- already be or become members of the organization
- not be undischarged bankrupts

- not previously have been removed from trusteeship of a charity by a Court or the Charity Commissioners
- not be under a disqualification order under the Company Directors' Disqualification Act 1986
- not be disqualified by the Charities Act 1993 (Section 72) from acting as a charity trustee
- undertake to fulfil their responsibilities and duties as a trustee of TOFS in good faith and in accordance with the law and within the objectives of TOFS
- not have financial interests in conflict with those of TOFS (either in person or through family or business connections) except where formally notified in a conflict of interest statement

INDUCTION AND TRAINING OF NEW TRUSTEES

To ensure Trustees are fully competent, TOFS will:

- Provide an up-to-date Trustee Induction Pack
- Support induction, in a manner tailored to the experience of the individual, by the use of a 'buddy' system whereby each new Trustee is guided by an experienced Trustee or recently retired Trustee
- Provide access to and where appropriate cover the costs of induction training
- Conduct de-briefing of retiring Trustees in order to review, and amend where necessary, the Induction of new Trustees
- Provide a job description for honorary officers

Objectives and aims

The principal objective of TOFS is to improve the lives of families of children born unable to swallow. We aim to do this by providing mutual support and information to parents of children born with tracheo-oesophageal fistula, oesophageal atresia and with the VACTERL Association.

Tracheo-oesophageal fistula and oesophageal atresia (OA) are rare congenital conditions of the oesophagus (food pipe) and/or trachea (airway) that affect newborn babies. Babies with TOF/OA need to have intensive neo-natal care prior to corrective surgery, normally within days of birth. Some children have to undergo additional surgical interventions later on in their lives.

Activities and Achievements:

During the '07-'08 accounting period our membership increased from 1058 members to 1136 members. We supplied information over the telephone, supported parents on a personal level and put plans in place for our biennial conference where families will meet up and learn more about the condition, its cause, treatment and ongoing management.

We supplied information to families in the form of leaflets, brochures, our TOF Child book, and quarterly newsletter, *CHEW*. We provided emotional support, listening to parents' concerns and offering advice and help where appropriate. We organised social events where families met up and forged friendships.

We continued to develop our website and commissioned a new 'child-friendly' TOFS logo which sends out a clear message about the support we offer to families. The community forum on our website played a big part in our activity over the year with members 'giving something back' by offering each other emotional support alleviating the feeling of isolation that is often synonymous with having a TOF child. We carefully monitored the forum to help us identify what members need from TOFS and where possible we met those needs. We offered advice to members in relation to benefits they are entitled to.

We increased our volunteering support with five long awaited new members on our Council of Management and almost doubled our volunteer team of telephone support with four new volunteers. Work commenced on the second edition of 'The TOF Child' book with revised articles and new topics. We supported our members in their fundraising efforts by providing TOFS sponsorship packs and promoting their efforts on our website.

We disseminated information to practitioners from health, education and social care. A hospital liaison sub-committee put plans in place to develop relationships with the big teaching hospitals to raise awareness of the group and the ongoing problems that our families face. We continued to employ our administrative assistant, Jayne Allitt at 20 hours per week and we appointed an office manager in June '08 also on a part-time basis. Our staff stagger their hours so that the office is usually available for enquiries from Monday to Friday.

Financial Review and Reserves policy

TOFS requires reserves in order to operate in the short term and to satisfy legal obligations in the event of the end of funding, a major reduction of funding or a delay in further funding becoming available. The reserves will enable proper notice to be given to the beneficiaries and staff and for all legally due payments to be made to staff, volunteers and the organisations with which we do business. Trustees have set the minimum level of reserves at an amount sufficient to cover trading for a six month period.

Investment policy and objectives:

Deposits are held at Lloyds TSB Bank Ltd and COIF Charities Investment Fund. These are organisations which identify with the Charity Sector and which are secure and pay interest on sums invested.

Accounting Convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2007), the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by charities, SORP 2005, the Companies Act 1985 and applicable accounting standards.

Incoming Resources

Voluntary income is received by way of donation and gifts and is included in full in the Statement Of Financial Activities when received. The value of services provided by volunteers has not been included.

Resources expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible Fixed Assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life:

Office equipment

33% on cost

Medical equipment

33% on cost

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
