REPORT OF THE DIRECTORS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2010

The directors present their report with the financial statements of the company for the year ended 31 December 2010

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITY

The principal activity of the company in the year under review was that of the supply of oil and gas burners and spares

REVIEW OF BUSINESS

Sales increased by 13% in the year under review However due to increased costs the margins obtained on these sales fell 10% resulting in a fall in gross profit

Operating costs continued to be controlled and showed an increase of 2 7% during the year to leave a pre-tax loss of £200,240 (2009 profit £52,053)

The directors believe that improvements in margins will help the company return to profitability in the current year

DIVIDENDS

No dividends will be distributed for the year ended 31 December 2010

FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS

The directors have been advised of the decision by Ecoflam Bruciatori SpA to invest a further £500,000 in the issued share capital of Ecoflam (UK) Limited. This further investment, which will eliminate the company's deficit and assist in the financing of working capital requirements, will occur in the current year.

C K Stone has held office during the whole of the period from 1 January 2010 to the date of this report

Other changes in directors holding office are as follows

A Rizzi - resigned 13 October 2010 A Mariotto - appointed 13 October 2010

C Martinangeli was appointed as a director after 31 December 2010 but prior to the date of this report

ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards

Financial Reporting Standard Number 1 (Revised 1996)

The company has taken advantage of the exemption available under FRS 1(Revised 1996) from preparing a cash flow statement as the company is a subsidiary of L-3 Communications Holdings Inc, an entity preparing publicly available consolidated accounts which include a cash flow statement into which the results of the company are consolidated

Turnover

Turnover represents net invoiced sales of goods, excluding value added tax

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life

Improvements to property

- in accordance with the property

Plant and machinery

- 25% on cost

Fixtures and fittings

- 25% on cost

Computer equipment

- 20% on cost

Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items

Taxation

Current taxation is provided at amounts expected to be paid (or recovered) using tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantially enacted at the balance sheet date

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date where transactions or events that result in an obligation to pay more tax in the future, or a right to pay less tax in the future, have occurred at the balance sheet date. Timing differences are differences between the company's taxable profits and its results as stated in the financial statements that arise from the inclusion of gains and losses in tax assessments in periods different from those in which they are recognised in the financial statements.

Deferred tax is measured at the average tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which the timing differences are expected to reverse, based on tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date, and is not discounted

A net deferred tax asset is regarded as recoverable and therefore recognised only when, on the basis of all available evidence, it can be regarded as more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted

Foreign currencies

Transactions in foreign currencies are recorded using the rate of exchange ruling at the date of the transaction Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated using the contracted rate or the rate of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date and the gains or losses on translation are included in the profit and loss account

Hire purchase and leasing commitments

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to the profit and loss account on a straight line basis over the period of the lease

Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

The company operates a defined contribution pension scheme Contributions payable to the company's pension scheme are charged to the profit and loss account in the period to which they relate

The company meets its day to day working capital requirements through an overdraft facility which is repayable on demand. The company's borrowings are secured by the support of its parent company.
