Financial Statements

The directors present their report and financial statements for the year ended 31 December 1997.

Directors' Responsibilities

Company law requires the directors to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the company's state of affairs at the end of the year and of its profit or loss for the year. In preparing those financial statements the directors are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;

 and explained in the financial statements; and

Notes to the financial statements

for the year ended 31 December 1997

1 Accounting policies

a) Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, modified to include the revaluation of certain tangible fixed assets, and in accordance with applicable accounting standards.

The company is exempt by virtue of Section 248 of the Companies Act 1985 from the requirement to prepare group financial statements.

b) Turnover

Turnover represents amounts receivable for services sold to third parties excluding value added tax and relates wholly to the principal activity all of which originates and is carried out in the United Kingdom.

c) Depreciation of tangible assets

Depreciation is provided on all tangible fixed assets in use, at rates and bases calculated to write off the cost, less estimated residual value, of each asset over the expected useful life, as follows:

Freehold property - 50 years
Furniture, fixtures and fittings - 4 years
Motor vehicles - 4 years
Computer equipment - 3 years

Leasehold improvements - period of the lease

d) Leased assets

Where the company has entered into finance leases, the obligations to the lessor are shown as part of the borrowings and the rights in the corresponding assets are treated in the same way as owned fixed assets. Leases are regarded as finance leases where their terms transfer to the lessee substantially all the benefits and burdens of ownership other than the rights to legal title.

Rentals payable under operating leases are charged to the profit and loss account as incurred.

e) Deferred taxation

Deferred taxation is accounted for using the liability method on all material timing differences to the extent that it is probable that a liability will crystallise. Timing differences are taxable items, allowances on reliefs which are given effect to in taxation periods different from those in which they have effect in the financial statements.

f) Pension costs

As the pension scheme is a defined contributions scheme, it has been accounted for on a contributions payable basis.

g) Cashflow statement

The company has not prepared a cashflow statement as it is exempt under the provisions of Financial Reporting Standard No. 1 (revised).

17 Contingent liabilities

The company has given unlimited multilateral guarantees between the company and other group undertakings, secured by a fixed and floating charge over the assets of the company to secure the borrowings of certain group undertakings. The net aggregate amount of these borrowings at 31 December 1997 was £149,552 (1996: £1,588,000). In addition, the company has given cross guarantees as part of the invoice discounting facility. The net aggregate amount outstanding against these facilities at 31 December 1997 was £39,642,000 (1996: £17,766,000).
