REPORT OF THE DIRECTORS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH 2000

The Board of Management presents its report and the audited financial statements for the year ended 31st March 2000.

OBJECTS AND ACTIVITIES

The objects of the charity are to relieve poor persons of Chinese origin primarily living or working in London in particular by the establishment and maintenance of an information and advice centre and to promote good race relations to help eliminate discrimination on grounds of race and to encourage equality of opportunity between persons of Chinese origin and persons of other racial or ethnic origin.

REVIEW OF THE YEAR

This was a significant year of growth for CIAC as a result of successful fundraising activities aimed at diversifying its sources of funds. Total income increased by 35% to over £173,000, enabling effective resourcing of existing and additional services to better meet clients' needs.

CIAC was awarded a further three years contract under the Legal Aid Board franchise to assist in immigration law issues for the Chinese community following a successful first year audit in December 1999. Other new services include CIAC's Domestic Violence Befriending project, translation of factsheets, publication of a free quarterly newsletter and the provision of workshops and seminars to other advice workers in the Chinese community.

INCOME AND EXPENDITURE ACCOUNT

A summary of the income and expenditure for the year is given on page 5 of the financial statements.

TANGIBLE FIXED ASSETS

Movements in fixed assets during the year are shown in note 5 to the financial statements.

STATEMENT OF DIRECTORS RESPONSIBILITIES

The directors are required by law to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity as at the end of the financial year and of the income and expenditure of the charity for that period. In preparing those financial statements, the directors are required to:

select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;

make judgements and estimates that are prudent;

follow applicable accounting standards;

prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in business.

The directors are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

AUDITORS

The auditors, John Rogers & Co., have stated that they will not be standing for re-appointment and a proposal for the appointment of new auditors will be put to the annual general meeting.

Basis of opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards issued by the Auditing Practices Board. An audit includes examination, on a test basis, of evidence relevant to the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. It also includes an assessment of the significant estimates and judgements made by the directors in the preparation of the financial statements, and of whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the charity's circumstances, consistently applied and adequately disclosed.

We planned and performed our audit so as to obtain all the information and explanations necessary in order to provide us with sufficient evidence to give reasonable assurance that the financial statements are free from material misstatement, whether caused by fraud or other irregularity or error. In forming our opinion we have also evaluated the overall adequacy of the presentation in the financial statements.

Opinion

In our opinion the financial statements give a true and fair view of the charity's affairs at 31st March 2000 and of its incoming resources and application of resources, including its income and expenditure, in the period then ended and have been properly prepared in accordance with the provisions of the Companies Act 1985.
