# **Directors' Report**

The Directors present their report and financial statements for the year ended 28 March 2004.

#### Principal activity and review of the business

The principal activity of the Company continues to be the sale of quality furnishings in the retail market.

Turnover has increased by 6% to £128,478,000 (2003: £120,909,000) during the year and operating profit increased by 5% from £5,301,000 to £5,592,000. Two new outlets were opened during the year with one closure, bringing the number of trading outlets to thirty-three.

#### **Results and Dividends**

The profit for the year, after taxation but before dividends, amounted to £4,267,000 (2003: £4,951,000). The Directors do not recommend the payment of a dividend (2003: £nil). Preference dividends of £222,000 (2003: £222,000) were also paid during the year.

#### **Future Developments**

A new store in South Ruislip, Middlesex, was opened in April 2004. Three new stores are planned for 2004/05 with further expansion opportunities being investigated.

#### **Directors and their Interests**

The current Directors, who are listed on page 1, all served throughout the year covered by this report, with the exception of Mr E G Wynne, who was appointed as a Director on 15 January 2004.

No Director held any "A" ordinary shares, any "B" ordinary shares nor any beneficial interest in the preference shares of the Company at 31 March 2003 or throughout the year ended 28 March 2004.

#### **Disabled Employees**

The Company gives full consideration to applications for employment from disabled persons where requirements of the job can be adequately fulfilled by a handicapped or disabled person.

Where existing employees become disabled, it is the Company's policy, wherever practicable, to provide continuing employment under normal terms and conditions and to provide training and career development and promotion to disabled employees wherever appropriate.

### **Employee involvement**

During the year, the policy of providing employees with information about the Group has been continued. Regular meetings are held between local management and employees to allow a free flow of information and ideas. Employees participate directly in the success of the business through the various incentive arrangements, which cover everyone employed within the business.

#### **Charitable Contributions**

The Company's charitable donations for the period were £29,076 (2003: £30,750).

#### **Events Subsequent to the Balance Sheet Date**

On 9 April 2004 a new store opened in South Ruislip, Middlesex, and on 12 April 2004, the Aylesbury store closed.

# Statement of Directors' responsibilities in respect of the financial statements

The Directors are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the Company and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 1985. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

We have audited the Company's financial statements for the year ended 28 March 2004 which comprise the Profit and Loss Account, Statement of Total Recognised Gains and Losses, Balance Sheet, Statement of Cash Flows and the related notes 1 to 22. These financial statements have been prepared on the basis of the accounting policies set out therein.

This report is made solely to the Company's members, as a body, in accordance with Section 235 of the Companies Act 1985. Our audit work has been undertaken so that we might state to the Company's members those matters we are required to state to them in an auditors' report and for no other purpose. To the fullest extent permitted by law, we do not accept or assume responsibility to anyone other than the Company and the Company's members as a body, for our audit work, for this report, or for the opinions we have formed.

### Respective responsibilities of Directors and auditors

As described in the Statement of Directors' Responsibilities the Company's Directors are responsible for the preparation of the financial statements in accordance with applicable United Kingdom law and accounting standards.

Our responsibility is to audit the financial statements in accordance with relevant legal and regulatory requirements and United Kingdom Auditing Standards.

We report to you our opinion as to whether the financial statements give a true and fair view and are properly prepared in accordance with the Companies Act 1985. We also report to you if, in our opinion, the Directors' Report is not consistent with the financial statements, if the Company has not kept proper accounting records, if we have not received all the information and explanations we require for our audit, or if information specified by law regarding Directors' remuneration and transactions with the Company is not disclosed.

We read the Directors' Report and consider the implications for our report if we become aware of any apparent misstatements within it.

### Basis of audit opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with United Kingdom Auditing Standards issued by the Auditing Practices Board. An audit includes examination, on a test basis, of evidence relevant to the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. It also includes an assessment of the significant estimates and judgements made by the Directors in the preparation of the financial statements, and of whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the Company's circumstances, consistently applied and adequately disclosed.

We planned and performed our audit so as to obtain all the information and explanations which we considered necessary in order to provide us with sufficient evidence to give reasonable assurance that the financial statements are free from material misstatement, whether caused by fraud or other irregularity or error. In forming our opinion we also evaluated the overall adequacy of the presentation of information in the financial statements.

### 1. Accounting Policies

#### Accounting Convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards. The accounting policies used in preparing the financial statements are consistent with those of the previous year.

#### Fixed assets

All fixed assets are initially recorded at cost. The carrying value of tangible fixed assets are reviewed for impairment in periods if events or changes in circumstances indicate the carrying value may not be recoverable.

#### Depreciation

Depreciation is provided on all tangible fixed assets at rates calculated to write off the cost or valuation, less estimated residual value, of each asset evenly over its expected useful life, as follows:

Short leasehold property

over the lease term

Fixtures, fittings and equipment

over 4-10 years

Motor vehicles

over 3-5 years

#### Stocks

Stocks are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost is determined on a first in, first out basis and net realisable value is based on estimated selling price less any further costs expected to be incurred to completion and disposal.

#### Deferred taxation

Deferred taxation is provided on all timing differences, arising from the different treatment for financial statements and taxation purposes of transactions and events recognised in the financial statements of the current and previous years. Deferred taxation is measured on an undiscounted basis at rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which the timing differences reverse, based on tax rates and laws enacted at the balance sheet date. Deferred taxation assets are only recognised to the extent that it is more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the underlying timing differences can be deducted.

#### Pension costs

The Company operates a defined contribution pension scheme for eligible employees. Eligibility is defined by length of service. Contributions are charged in the profit and loss account as they become payable in accordance with the rules of the scheme.

#### New stores pre-trading costs

The costs associated with the pre-trading period of new stores are written off in the year in which they are incurred.

#### Rent free periods and reverse premiums

During the course of opening new stores, operating leases are negotiated which may include rent-free periods and/or reverse premiums. Rent free periods and net reverse premiums are amortised from the date of trading on a straight-line basis over the period to the next open market rent review.

# Leasing commitments

Rentals payable under operating leases are charged in the profit and loss account on a straight-line basis over the lease term.

# 1. Accounting Policies (continued)

#### Foreign currencies

Transactions in foreign currencies are recorded at the rate ruling at the date of the transaction or at the contracted rate if the transaction is covered by a forward foreign currency contract. Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are retranslated at the rate of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date or, if appropriate, at the forward contract rate. All differences are taken to the profit and loss account.

#### 2. Turnover

Turnover, which is stated net of value added tax, represents the value of goods delivered and invoiced to customers. Turnover relates to one continuing activity, the retailing of household furniture within the United Kingdom.

#### 20. Related Parties

As part of their employment the Directors and employees can purchase goods from the Company at a discount. The amount of goods purchased by the Directors is not considered to be material either to the Company or to the individuals. The discounts for the Directors are on the same terms as those of all other employees. The Company has taken advantage of the exemption allowed under FRS 8: Related party disclosures, from disclosing transactions with related parties that are part of the Furniture Village Group, as the Company is a 100% subsidiary of a Group whose financial statements are publicly available.

### 21. Pension Arrangements

The company operated a defined contribution pension scheme for eligible employees. The assets of the scheme are held separately from those of the company in an independently administered fund. Prepaid contributions at the year end amounted to £10,000 (2003: £22,000).

#### 22. Parent Undertaking and Controlling Party

In the Directors' opinion, the Company's ultimate parent undertaking and controlling party is Furniture Village Group Limited, registered in England and Wales.
