NOTES TO THE ABBREVIATED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 1 APRIL 2001

1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective March 2000).

Turnover

Turnover represents the total invoice value, excluding value added tax, of goods sold and services rendered during the year.

Condwill

Goodwill is the difference between the amount paid on the acquisition of a business and the aggregate fair value of its separate net assets. Goodwill is amortised through the profit and loss account over the directors' estimate of its estimated economic life.

Depreciation of tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its useful life:

Fixtures, fittings and equipment

10% on reducing balance

Where zero depreciation of freehold buildings is appropriate

Freehold buildings are depreciated to write down the cost less estimated residual value over their remaining useful life by equal annual instalments. Where buildings are maintained to such a standard that their residual value is not less than their cost or valuation, no depreciation is charged as it is not material.

Stocks

Stocks are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Net realisable value is based on estimated selling price less further costs to completion and disposal.

Going concern

The accounts have been prepared on going concern basis on the assumption that the holding company shall continue to provide financial support as and when required.
