REPORT OF THE DIRECTORS for the Year Ended 31 March 2009

The directors present their report with the accounts of the company for the year ended 31 March 2009.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITY

The principal activity of the company in the year under review was that of electrical installation engineers.

REVIEW OF BUSINESS

Review of business activities and future developments

Over the last twelve months, the company has consolidated its financial position showing profit before taxation of £187,203 (2008 £245,016) achieved on turnover of £29,154,507 (2008 £21,789,120). This profitability has been achieved by the increase in turnover which has offset the decrease in margin and the increase in administrative expenses. Gross margin on turnover of 13.8% in 2009 is down from 15.3% in 2008. Administrative expenses have increased by £761,000 in the year the majority being due to increased salary costs and pension provisions. Average number of in house employees has increased from 148 in 2008 to 153 in 2009

Principal risks and uncertainties

The key business risk and uncertainty affecting the company is considered to relate to competition from rival companies. This potential risk has been mitigated by the company's competitive pricing policy and its commitment to delivering a cost-effective service which will provide the customer with a high quality installation.

Strategic priorities

The board and management of C A Sothers Limited are committed to continue to deliver the reliable, responsible growth which the company has enjoyed over recent years.

Outlook

The company currently has a good order book and operates in a healthy market which offers a substantial opportunity for growth. The board are clear about the priorities required for continued development of the business in both the medium and long term and have the proven management capability to deliver.

DIVIDENDS

An interim dividend of £30 per share was paid on the Ordinary £1 shares on 22 April 2008. No dividends were paid on any other classes of shares.

The total distribution of dividends for the year ended 31 March 2009 will be £150,000.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Turnover

Turnover represents net invoiced sales of goods, excluding value added tax.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life or, if held under a finance lease, over the lease term, whichever is the shorter.

Plant and machinery

- 25% on reducing balance

Fixtures and fittings

- 25% on reducing balance

Motor vehicles

- 30% on reducing balance

Computer equipment

- 25% on cost

Stocks

Stocks and work in progress are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items.

Cost includes all direct expenditure and an appropriate proportion of fixed and variable overheads.

Long term contracts are assessed on a contract basis and are reflected in the profit and loss account by recording turnover and related costs as contract activity progresses. Where the outcome of each long term contract can be assessed with reasonable certainty before its conclusion, the attributable profit is recognised in the profit and loss account as the difference between the reported turnover and related costs for that contract.

Deferred tax

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date.

Hire purchase and leasing commitments

Assets obtained under hire purchase contracts or finance leases are capitalised in the balance sheet. Those held under hire purchase contracts are depreciated over their estimated useful lives. Those held under finance leases are depreciated over their estimated useful lives or the lease term, whichever is the shorter.

The interest element of these obligations is charged to the profit and loss account over the relevant period. The capital element of the future payments is treated as a liability.

Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

The company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the company's pension scheme are charged to the profit and loss account in the period to which they relate.

Profit recognition on contract activity

When the outcome of individual contracts can be foreseen with reasonable certainty and can be estimated reliably, margin is recognised by reference to the stage of completion, based on the lower of the percentage margin earned to date and that prudently forecast at completion. Full provision is made for all known or expected losses on individual contracts immediately once such losses are forseen.

Pre-contract costs are expensed as incurred until it is virtually certain that a contract will be awarded from which time further pre-contract costs are recognised as an asset and charged as an expense over the period of the contract.
