DIRECTORS' REPORT

The directors present their annual report and the audited financial statements for the year ended 31 August 1995.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES

The company is an investment holding company.

RESULTS, FUTURE PROSPECTS AND DIVIDENDS

The loss for the year before taxation amounted to £12,861 (1994 - loss of £7,185). The directors do not recommend the payment of a dividend (1994 - £nil) and the retained loss of £12,861 (1994 - loss of £7,185) has been transferred from reserves. The directors remain confident about the future prospects of the company.

FIXED ASSETS

Movements in fixed assets investments are shown in note 5 to the accounts.

SHARE CAPITAL

On 16 May 1995 the company consolidated its participating redeemable preference shares from £1 shares to £1,000 shares (referred to as the Recapitalisation in note 8). As a result the number of participating redeemable preference shares in issue was reduced to 106,832 from 106,731,666.

On 28 June 1995 the company reduced the nominal value of its preference share capital from £1,000 each to £769.15 each. As a result a cash payment of £230.85 per share was made to the shareholders.

STATEMENT OF DIRECTORS' RESPONSIBILITIES

Basis of opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with Auditing Standards issued by the Auditing Practices Board. An audit includes examination, on a test basis, of evidence relevant to the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. It also includes an assessment of the significant estimates and judgements made by the directors in the preparation of the financial statements, and of whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the company's circumstances, consistently applied and adequately disclosed.

We planned and performed our audit so as to obtain all the information and explanations which we considered necessary in order to provide us with sufficient evidence to give reasonable assurance that the financial statements are free from material misstatement, whether caused by fraud or other irregularity or error. 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards. The particular accounting policies adopted are described below.

Accounting convention

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention.

Foreign exchange

Transactions denominated in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rates ruling at the dates of the transactions. Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies at the balance sheet date are translated at the rates ruling at that date. These translation differences are dealt with in the profit and loss account.

Investments

Investments are stated at cost less any provision for permanent diminution in value.

At the year end the company owned 40.8% of the equity share capital of Videotron Holdings Plc, a company registered in England and Wales. The company is involved in the operation of cable television and telecommunication networks. If group accounts were prepared, under the provision of Statement of Standard Accounting Practice No. 1, the company would be required to treat the investment as an associated company. Since the company is not required to produce group accounts, the effect of equity accounting for the investment has been shown in note 5 to the accounts.

Deferred taxation

Deferred taxation is provided at the anticipated tax rates on timing differences arising from the inclusion of items of income and expenditure in taxation computations in periods different from those in which they are included in the financial statements to the extent that it is likely that a liability or asset will crystallise in the future.

8. CALLED UP SHARE CAPITAL (continued)

On 16 May 1995 the company restructured its share capital by consolidating its participating redeemable preference shares from £1 shares to £1,000 shares (referred to above as Recapitalisation). On 28 June 1995 a court order was granted permitting the company to reduce its share capital. As a result the nominal value of the participating redeemable preference shares was reduced to £769.15 from £1,000.

The rights attaching to the participating redeemable preference share are as follows:

- (i) to participate pari passu with the ordinary shares in all dividends declared and paid.
- (ii) on a repayment of assets whether on a winding up or reduction of capital or otherwise to repayment of the capital paid up on such preference shares together with the sum equal to any arrears and accruals of any fixed dividend declared calculated down to the date of winding up or repayment as appropriate in priority to any payment to the holders of any other class of share.
- (iii) to receive notice but not to attend or vote at any General Meeting of the company or any separate meeting of the holders of any class of share.
- (iv) to require the company, by giving notice in writing, to redeem any or all of the preference shares at par and to be notified by the company, within seven days of receipt of this notice, the date and place that the redemption shall take place. No preference share redeemed by the company shall be capable of re-issue.
