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DIRECTORS' REPORT

The directors present their report and the accounts for the year ended 31 December 1994.

Activities

The principal activity of the company continues to be acting as a Trustee on behalf of the secured loan note holders of the Skillion Group Limied.

Review of affairs

During the year, the company has accounted for distributions made by the receivers of the Skillion Group Limited directly to the secured loan note holders amounting to £505,000 (1993: Nil).

The directors are satisfied with the state of the company's affairs at 31 December 1994.

Results for the year

The loss for the year after taxation was £379 (1993: Loss £5). The directors do not recommend the payment of a dividend (1993: £Nil).
