1 Accounting policies

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the company's financial statements.

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards, under the historical cost accounting rules. The accounts have also been prepared on the going concern basis, since the Company's direct holding company, P&O Ferries (Holdings) Limited, has indicated that it will continue to provide such financial and other support as is necessary to enable the Company to continue to operate.

Cash flow statement

Under Financial Reporting Standard 1, the company is exempt from the requirement to prepare a cash flow statement on the grounds that its parent undertaking includes the company in its own published consolidated financial statements.

Turnover

Turnover represents amounts (excluding value-added tax) derived from charter hire income, which is evenly recognised over the period of charter.

Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Depreciation is provided to write off cost less the estimated residual value of tangible fixed assets by equal instalments over their estimated useful lives as follows:

Leased Ships

15 years from March 1998

Provision for any impairment in the value of ships is made in the profit and loss account.

Deferred taxation

Deferred taxation is recognised without discounting, in respect of all timing differences between the treatment of certain items for taxation and accounting purposes which have arisen and not reversed by the balance sheet date, except as otherwise required by FRS 19. A net deferred tax asset is regarded as recoverable and therefore recognised only when, on the basis of all available evidence, it can be regarded as more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted.

Leases

Assets acquired under finance leases are capitalised and the outstanding future lease obligations are shown in creditors. Operating lease rentals are charged to the profit and loss account on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.
