DIRECTORS' REPORT

The directors present their annual report and the audited financial statements for the year ended 31 May 2007

ACTIVITIES

The principal activity of the group during the year was the provision of football and other related activities

REVIEW OF DEVELOPMENTS AND FUTURE PROSPECTS

The company remains the parent company of the wholly owned subsidiaries Wolverhampton Wanderers FC (1986) Limited and Wolverhampton Wanderers Properties Limited

The year under review was the first since relegation from the F A Premier League when no 'parachute payment' was received In these circumstances the directors consider the financial result for the year to be satisfactory. However, they were very disappointed that the club were defeated in the playoff semi-finals thus preventing a possible return to The Premier League.

Revenue for the year was lower than the previous year at £15 9m (2006 - £23 8m) primarily due to the loss of the parachute payment from the Premier League which meant that at operating levels (before player trading), the current year incurred an operating loss of £2 5m compared to a profit of £1 3m in 2006

However, a net profit on player trading brought about by a high value of player disposals during the year, generated an operating profit after player trading of just over £1 1m (2006 – loss of £906k)

Combined Player and Football Management Costs decreased during the year representing the changes made in both of these key areas in an effort to sustain the shortfall in revenue. Player amortisation also reduced by a sizeable amount reflected by a year when the club became a net seller in the market.

The club finished the season at 5th position compared to 7th position the previous year. Attendances were healthy and despite a fall of almost 11% compared to prior year levels still averaged at just under 21,000, 1,000 ahead of expected levels.

The aim remains to regain Premiership League status as soon as possible and the directors believe the first team squad is capable of being a strong candidate for promotion

Details of post year end trading are set out in note 30 to the financial statements

Subsequent Developments (Post Balance Sheet date)

On 9th August 2007, 75% of the Company's share capital was acquired by Carden Leisure Ltd and 25% by Mr S P Morgan who was appointed Chairman on that date

Simultaneously and pro rata to these acquisition arrangements, the issued share capital was increased by a further £30 000,000. These additional shares were allocated and fully paid up in cash

The company wishes to put on record its gratitude towards its former Chairman, Sir Jack Hayward and in recognition of his unique commitment has asked him to remain Life President and he has agreed to do so

RESULTS AND DIVIDENDS

The directors do not recommend the payment of a dividend (2006 £ml) The profit of the group for the year after taxation of £819,790 (2006 -loss of £1,155,166) has been transferred to reserves

FINANCIAL RISK MANAGEMENT

The directors have reviewed the financial risk management objectives and policies of the group and these are set out in further detail in note 25 to the financial statements

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The principal accounting policies are summarised below. They have all been applied consistently throughout the year and the preceding year.

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, modified to include the revaluation of the stadium redevelopment and training facilities, and in accordance with applicable United Kingdom accounting standards

Basis of consolidation

The group financial statements consolidate the financial statements of the company and its subsidiary undertakings drawn up to 31 May each year

Turnover

Turnover represents match receipts and other income associated with the principal activity of running a professional football club and excludes value added tax. All turnover is derived from activities in the UK

Deferred income

Revenues received in advance are credited to deferred income and released to the profit and loss account over the period to which they relate

Grants received in respect of safety work and ground improvements are credited to deferred grant income and are released to the profit and loss account over the anticipated useful life of the assets to which they relate

Taxation

Current taxation is provided at amounts expected to be paid (or received) using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date '

Deferred taxation is provided in full on timing differences that result in an obligation at the balance sheet date to pay more tax, or a right to pay less tax at a future date, at rates expected to apply when they crystallise based on current tax rates and law. Timing differences arise from the inclusion of income and expenditure in tax computations in periods different from those in which they are included in the financial statements. Deferred tax assets are recognised to the extent that it is regarded as more likely than not that they will be recovered. Deferred tax is not provided on timing differences arising from the revaluation of fixed assets where there is no binding contract to dispose of these assets. Deferred tax assets and liabilities are not discounted.

Depreciation and tangible fixed assets

Depreciation of tangible fixed assets is calculated to write off their cost or valuation less any residual value on a straight line basis over their estimated useful lives at annual rates as follows

Stadium development	2%
Training facilities	2%
Plant and equipment	10%
Motor vehicles	20%
Fixtures and fittings	12 5%

The Group has entered into a policy of regular revaluation of the stadium development and training facilities Remaining assets are carried at historical cost

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

Intangible fixed assets and goodwill

The costs associated with the acquisition of players' registrations are capitalised as intangible fixed assets. These costs are fully amortised in equal annual instalments, over the period of the respective players' contracts. Provision for impairment is made when it becomes apparent that any diminution in value is permanent.

Goodwill amounting to £1,659,999 (2006 - £1,659,999) relating to prior periods was historically written off against the profit and loss reserve as a matter of accounting policy and remains eliminated against that reserve This amount will be charged or credited in the profit and loss account on any subsequent disposal of the associated business. Any future goodwill, will be capitalised in the balance sheet and amortised over its useful life.

Signing-on fees

Signing-on fees payable to players are charged, as part of operating expenses, to the profit and loss account over the period of the player's contract. Where a player's registration is transferred, any signing on fees payable in respect of future periods are charged against profit or loss on disposal of players' registrations.

Contingent appearance fees

Where the directors consider the likelihood of a player meeting future performance and appearance criteria laid down in the transfer agreement of that player to be probable, provision for this cost is made (see note 16) If the likelihood of meeting these criteria is not probable no provision is made (see note 27)

Pensions

Defined contribution arrangements are made to eligible employees of the company The pension cost charged in the year represents contributions payable by the company

Leases and hire purchase contracts

Tangible fixed assets acquired under finance leases and hire purchase contracts are capitalised at the estimated fair value at the date of inception of each lease or contract. The total finance charges are allocated over the period of the lease in such a way as to give a reasonably constant charge on the outstanding liability.

Rentals paid under operating leases are written off to the profit and loss account as incurred

Investments

Investments held as fixed assets are stated at cost less provision for any impairment

Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost is computed on a first in first out basis. Net realisable value is based on estimated selling price less the estimated cost of disposal.

2. CONSOLIDATED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

As permitted by Section 230 of the Companies Act 1985, the profit and loss account of the parent company is not presented as part of these financial statements. The parent company's profit (see note 20) for the financial year amounted to £525 669 (2006 - £1,655). The company's profit for the year was increased by £535,814 (2006 - £16,742) due to movements in provisions which are made against intercompany receivables.

8. TAX ON PROFIT/(LOSS) ON ORDINARY ACTIVITIES

The group has no liability for taxation owing to the availability of tax losses carried forward. The tax losses carried forward, subject to the agreement of the tax authorities, amount to approximately £28 8 million (2006 - £31 0 million)

Deferred tax assets are recognised to the extent that it is regarded as more likely than not they will be recovered. The potential deferred tax asset of approximately £8.7 million (2006–£9.4 million), which arises substantially in respect of losses carned forward, has not been recognised as it is not expected that there will be taxable profits available in the foreseeable future against which the losses may be offset

The tax assessed for the year is different than that resulting from applying the standard rate of corporation tax in the UK of 30% (2006 30%)

Included within training facilities are long term leases with a net book value of £422 500 (2006 £432,500). The depreciation on these leased assets was £10,000 (2006 £10,000).

The stadium development was last valued at £36 6 million, on a depreciated replacement cost basis by Dunlop Haywards, Consultant Surveyors, on 20 September 2006. This valuation has been incorporated in these accounts as the directors are of the opinion that there was no material change to the value of the stadium since this valuation. At 31 May 2007, the net book value determined according to the historical cost convention would be £12,624,190 (cost of £17,555,353 less accumulated depreciation of £4,931,163).

At 31 May 2007 the net book value of the total training facilities determined according to the historical cost convention would be £4,062,152 cost of £4,360 317 less accumulated depreciation of £298 165

25. FINANCIAL RISK MANAGEMENT

The directors have reviewed the financial risk management objectives and policies of the group and do not consider it necessary to use hedging instruments or enter into any speculative financial instruments

There is a comprehensive system in place for reporting financial information to the Board including the preparation of budgets for each business activity, monthly accounts comparisons to budget and last year and regular profit and loss projections and cash flow forecasts

Price Risk

This is largely governed by the division the club is operating within and prices are set out accordingly. The policy adopted recognises the inherent value of our fan base and core supporters. By monitoring feedback and industry pricing we look to offer the best value for money.

Liquidity & Cashflow Risk

A large part of our seasonal business is paid upfront ahead of fixtures taking place through our Early Bird Scheme on both ticketing and corporate business. Any fluctuations in cashflow during the season will arise through player transactions during the transfer window periods and match to match business primarily dependent upon attendance levels/team performance.

Credit Risk

As most of our business is either paid for in advance of the season (if seasonal) there is very little exposure to credit risk. The timing of player transfer receipts is governed by stringent Football League rules as are ticket sales to away clubs.

27 CONTINGENT LIABILITIES

In addition to amounts provided in note 16, the group may in future be required to pay contingent sums, dependent on the occurrence of future first team and international appearances and on field playing success of £1,117,500 (2006 - £495,000)

The company is party to an unlimited, supported cross guarantee with its subsidiary undertakings and given in favour of its bankers. The company's potential liability under this cross guarantee at 31 May 2007 is £1,400,000 (2006 - £4 517 617)

28. PENSIONS

Certain staff of the company are members of either the Football League Limited Retirement Income Scheme, a defined contribution scheme, or the Football League Limited Pension and Life Assurance Scheme ("FLLPLAS"), a defined benefit scheme. As the company is one of a number of participating employers in the FLLPLAS, it is not possible to allocate any actuarial surplus or deficit on a meaningful basis and consequently contributions are expensed in the profit and loss account as they become payable. The assets of the scheme are held separately from those of the group, being invested with insurance companies. Under the provisions of FRS17 the scheme is treated as a defined benefit multi employer scheme.

The scheme's actuary has advised that the participating employer's share of the underlying assets and liabilities cannot be identified on a reasonable and consistent basis and, accordingly, no disclosures are made under the provisions of FRS17. At 1 April 2006, an MFR deficit was identified in the scheme, of which £57 638 was allocated to Wolverhampton Wanderers resulting in a continuation of contributions advised by the Actuary The total pension cost for the year was £93 317 (2006 - £151 141)

29 ULTIMATE PARENT COMPANY AND CONTROLLING PARTY

From 9 August 2007 the ultimate parent company is Bridgemere Investments Ltd, a company incorporated in Guernsey. The company is a 75% undertaking of Carden Leisure Ltd, a company incorporated in England and Wales, which is in turn a wholly owned subsidiary of Carden Group Ltd and Bridgemere UK pic.

30. POST BALANCE SHEET EVENTS

On 9th August 2007, 75% of the Company's share capital was acquired by Carden Leisure Ltd and 25% by Mr S P Morgan who was appointed Chairman on that date

Simultaneously and pro rata to these acquisition arrangements, the issued share capital was increased by a further £30,000,000

These additional shares were allocated and fully paid in cash

Since the year end, the company has sold players' registrations recorded as intangible assets with a value at the balance sheet date of £954,632 (2006 - £867 103) resulting in a profit on sale of £218,555 (2006 - profit of £5,781,163) In addition, the company has acquired players' registrations with a value of £7,288,272 (2006 - £2 366,620) since the balance sheet date
