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REPORT OF THE DIRECTORS AND TRUSTEES

The directors and trustees have pleasure in presenting their report and accounts for the year ended 31 December 1998.

OBJECTS OF THE CHARITY, PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES AND ORGANISATION OF OUR WORK

The charity is constituted as a company limited by guarantee, and is therefore governed by a memorandum and articles of association.

The charity's object and its principal activity continue to be the restoration and preservation of the Brunels' Engine House and surroundings at Rotherhithe, and the establishment therein of a permanent collection and exhibition recording the achievement of Sir Marc Brunel and his son in the construction of the Thames Tunnel.

REVIEW OF THE PERIOD AND FUTURE ACTIVITIES

The directors and trustees regard the financial position and the level of activity of the charity at 31 December 1998 as satisfactory and forecast that this situation will continue in the foreseeable future. The Statement of Financial Activities shows net income for the year of £303. The Unrestricted Funds of the charity after transfer of the surplus for the year stand at £19,843.

FIXED ASSETS

Changes in fixed assets during the year are detailed in Note 4 to the accounts.

SHARE CAPITAL

The Company does not have a share capital and is limited by guarantee as described in Note 8 to the accounts.

RESERVES POLICY

The charity aims to maintain a minimum level of reserves as recommended by the Charity Commission as prudent financial management.

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 1998

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

(a) Basis of preparation of accounts

The accounts are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards and comply with the provisions of the Statement of Recommended Practice Accounting by Charities (October 1995).

The charity has taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No 1 from the requirement to produce a cashflow statement.

- (b) Subscription are credited to income when received.
- (c) Depreciation is calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of fixed assets on a straight line basis over their estimated useful lives. The rates of depreciation used are:

Fixtures and fittings 25% per annum.

Museum staging and equipment 12.5% per annum.

Office equipment 25% per annum.

- (d) Stocks are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value. The stock of the publication 'Brunel's Tunnel and where it led', worth in excess of £3,500, donated by British Petroleum plc, is carried in the accounts without value.
- (e) The charity holds a permanent collection of books and coins which it has acquired over time by gift and purchase. No value has been attributed to the collection in the books of account.

2. TRUSTEES AND STAFF COSTS

The eight directors and trustees (1997: eight) are the only employees of the charity. They received no remuneration or other benefits during the year (1997 - Nil).
