Directors' report

The directors present their annual report on the affairs of the Group, together with the financial statements and auditors' report, for the year ended 29 December 2011 The opening balance figures are for the period ended 29 December 2010

Principal activities

The principal activities of the Group are film and television services, comprise the licensing, production, post-production, financing, marketing and distribution of film and television programmes

Business review

The profit after taxation for the year amounted to £796,000 (2010 profit of £467,000) Revenues of £21 3m were achieved (2010 £44 1m), the 2010 result being significantly higher due as a result of first cycle new royalties generated from film investments

During the year the Group bought out the minority interest partner of a 60% subsidiary for a nominal fee Prior to the acquisition a distribution of £675,000 was made split between the majority and minority interests (2010 drawing of £150,000 split between the majority and minority interests)

Going concern

After making enquiries, the directors have a reasonable expectation that the Company and the Group have adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Accordingly, they continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the financial statements.

Further details regarding the adoption of the going concern basis can be found in the Statement of accounting policies in the financial statements

Financial risk management objectives and policies

The Group's activities expose it to a number of financial risks including credit risk, cash flow risk and liquidity risk. The company does not use derivatives to manage its financial risks

Credit risk

The Group's principal financial assets are bank balances and cash, trade and other receivables, and investments

The Group's credit risk is primarily attributable to its trade receivables. The amounts presented in the balance sheet are net of allowances for doubtful receivables. An allowance for impairment is made where there is an identified loss event which, based on previous experience, is evidence of a reduction in the recoverability of the cash flows

The Group has no significant concentration of credit risk, with exposure spread over a large number of counterparties and customers

Cash flow risk

The Group's activities expose it primarily to the financial risks of changes in foreign currency exchange rates Interest bearing assets and liabilities are held at fixed rate to ensure certainty of cash flows

Liquidity risk

In order to maintain liquidity to ensure that sufficient funds are available for ongoing operations and future developments, the company uses a mixture of long-term and short-term debt finance

Notes to the financial statements For the year ended 29 December 2011

1. Accounting policies

The principal accounting policies are summarised below. The particular accounting policies adopted are described below and have been applied consistently in both years.

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable United Kingdom accounting standards

Basis of consolidation

The Group financial statements consolidate the financial statements of the Company and its subsidiary undertakings drawn up to 29 December 2011 (and up to 29 December 2010 in the prior year). The results of subsidiaries acquired or sold are consolidated for the years from or to the date on which control passed. Acquisitions are accounted for under the acquisition method.

Going concern

The Group's business activities, together with the factors likely to affect its future development, performance and position are set out in the Business Review on page 2

The Group meets its day to day working capital requirements through the intercompany transfer of funds throughout the Group. The Group has external debt which is repayable when the Group and the counterparty agree that the Group should do so. The counterparty has confirmed that it will not seek repayment of amounts owing in the next twelve months (see note 14). In addition, the Group has valuable assets with its film library and freehold New York property.

The current economic conditions create uncertainty particularly over (a) the level of demand for the Group's products, particularly in respect of its post-production and DVD/Blu-Ray authoring operations, and (b) the exchange rate between sterling and US dollar and thus the consequence for the transatlantic movement of cash around the Group

The Group's forecasts and projections, taking account of reasonably possible changes in trading performance, show that the Group should be able to operate within the level of its current cash flows. After making enquiries, the directors have a reasonable expectation that the Company and the Group have adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Accordingly, they continue to adopt the going concern bases in preparing the annual report and accounts.

Intangible assets - film library

Films in production are included at cost, including finance costs, and an appropriate proportion of overheads

Films produced or acquired for distribution are included at the lower of cost and estimated net realisable value Cost includes production costs and overheads or acquisition costs where appropriate

Films held as intangible assets are amortised as a percentage of the current revenue over the total revenue expected in the following six years

The market value of certain individual films may exceed book value

1. Accounting policies (continued)

Tangible fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost or valuation, net of depreciation and any provision for impairment Depreciation is provided on all tangible fixed assets, other than freehold land, at rates calculated to write off the cost or valuation, less estimated residual value, of each asset on a straight-line basis over its expected useful life, as follows

Freehold building - 5%
Leasehold improvements - 5%
Studio equipment - 20%
Fixtures, fittings and office equipment - 20-33%

Residual value is calculated on prices prevailing at the date of acquisition or revaluation

Investments

Except as stated below, fixed asset investments are shown at cost less provision for impairment. Current asset investments, representing investments in content, are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Stocks

Stocks are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Net realisable value is based on estimated selling price, less further costs expected to be incurred to completion and disposal. Provision is made for obsolete, slow-moving or defective items where appropriate

Long-term contracts

Amounts recoverable on long-term contracts, which are included in debtors, are stated at the net sales value of the work done less amounts received as progress payments on account. Excess progress payments are included in creditors as payments on account. Cumulative costs incurred net of amounts transferred to cost of sales, less provision for contingencies and anticipated future losses on contracts, are included as long-term contract balances in stock.

Taxation

Current tax, including UK corporation tax and foreign tax, is provided at amounts expected to be paid (or recovered) using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date where transactions or events that result in an obligation to pay more tax in the future or a right to pay less tax in the future have occurred at the balance sheet date. Timing differences are differences between the Group's taxable profits and its results as stated in the financial statements that arise from the inclusion of gains and losses in tax assessments in years different from those in which they are recognised in the financial statements.

A net deferred tax asset is regarded as recoverable and therefore recognised only to the extent that, on the basis of all available evidence, it can be regarded as more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted

Deferred tax is measured at the average tax rates that are expected to apply in the years in which the timing differences are expected to reverse based on tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date

Notes to the financial statements For the year ended 29 December 2011

1. Accounting policies (continued)

Turnover

Turnover is stated net of VAT and trade discounts. Film and television royalties, as well as advanced minimum guarantees, are recognised at the point at which a reliable estimate can be made. For all other income streams, turnover from the sale of goods is recognised when the goods are physically delivered to the customer. Turnover from the supply of services represents the value of services provided under contracts to the extent that there is a right to consideration and is recorded at the value of the consideration due. Where a contract has only been partially completed at the balance sheet date turnover represents the value of the service provided to date based on a proportion of the total contract value. Where payments are received from customers in advance of services provided, the amounts are recorded as Deferred Income and included as part of Creditors due within one year.

Profit is recognised on long-term contracts, if the final outcome can be assessed with reasonable certainty, by including in the profit and loss account turnover and related costs as contract activity progresses. Turnover is calculated by reference to the value of work performed to date as a proportion of the total contract value.

Foreign currencies

Transactions in foreign currencies are recorded at the rate of exchange at the date of the transaction. Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies at the balance sheet date are reported at the rates of exchange prevailing at that date.

The results of overseas operations are translated at the average rates of exchange during the year and their balance sheets at the rates ruling at the balance sheet date. Exchange differences arising on translation of the opening net assets and on foreign currency borrowings are reported in the statement of total recognised gains and losses. All other exchange differences are included in the profit and loss account.

Leases

Assets held under finance leases and other similar contracts, which confer rights and obligations similar to those attached to owned assets, are capitalised as tangible fixed assets and are depreciated over the shorter of the lease terms and their useful lives. The capital elements of future lease obligations are recorded as liabilities, while the interest elements are charged to the profit and loss account over the year of the leases to produce a constant rate of charge on the balance of capital repayments outstanding. Hire purchase transactions are dealt with similarly, except that assets are depreciated over their useful lives.

Rentals under operating leases are charged on a straight-line basis over the lease term, even if the payments are not made on such a basis. Benefits received and receivable as an incentive to sign an operating lease are similarly spread on a straight-line basis over the lease term, except where the year to the review date on which the rent is first expected to be adjusted to the prevailing market rate is shorter than the full lease term, in which case the shorter year is used

Finance costs

Finance costs of financial liabilities are recognised in the profit and loss account over the term of such instruments at a constant rate on the carrying amount

Financial liabilities and equity

Financial liabilities and equity instruments are classified according to the substance of the contractual arrangements entered into. An equity instrument is any contract that evidences a residual interest in the assets of the Group after deducting all of its liabilities.
