DIRECTORS' REPORT

The directors present their report and the financial statements of the company for the period from 1 April 2013 to 30 September 2014.

Principal activities

PRESSBOF is an independent body set up by the main organisations representing newspaper and magazine publishers. The organisations represented on the Board of Directors are:

The News Media Association

(formed from the merger of the Newspaper Publishers Association and the Newspaper Society) Professional Publishers' Association

Scottish Newspaper Society

The principal activity of PRESSBOF is to collect funds for the purpose of financing the self-regulatory arrangements for newspapers and magazines in the U.K. centred on the Press Complaints Commission.

PRESSBOF ceased trading at the 30 September 2014. The Press Complaints Commission closed on 8 September 2014 and has been replaced by the Independent Press Standards Organisation (IPSO).

We have audited the financial statements of The Press Standards Board of Finance Limited for the period from 1 April 2013 to 30 September 2014 which comprise the Profit and Loss Account, Balance Sheet, Cash Flow Statement and the related notes. 1. Accounting policies

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with applicable UK accounting standards.

Going concern

PRESSBOF ceased trading on the 30 September 2014. The Press Complaints Commission closed on 8 September 2014 and has been replaced by the Independent Press Standards Organisation (IPSO).

Turnover

Registration fee income is credited to the Profit and Loss Account in the period in which it is received.

Transition income was dealt with on an accruals basis.

Operating lease agreements

Rentals applicable to operating leases where substantially all of the benefits and risks of ownership remain with the lessor are charged against profits on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.

Financial instruments

Financial instruments are classified and accounted for, according to the substance of the contractual arrangement, as either financial assets, financial liabilities or equity instruments. An equity instrument is any contract that evidences a residual interest in the assets of the company after deducting all of its liabilities.

2. Turnover

Turnover represents the registration fees collected from newspaper and magazine publishers during the year, as well as transition income regarding the set up of the Regulatory Funding Committee.

3. Charges

Charges represent payments to the Press Complaints Commission for the self-regulatory arrangements for newspapers and magazines in the United Kingdom.
