DIRECTORS REPORT

The directors submit their annual report together with the financial statements of the Company for the year ended 31 December 2014.

RESULTS AND DIVIDENDS

The profit for the year after taxation amounted to £Nil (2013: £5,008,000).

During the year the Company received no dividends (2013: £5,655,000). The directors did not pay a dividend to its parent company during the year (2013: £4,306,000). The directors do not recommend the payment of a final dividend for the year. (2013: £Nil).

The Company qualifies as a small company under section 382 of the Companies Act 2006 and as such is exempt from the requirements to prepare a business review or to prepare a Strategic Report. As the Company is part of an ineligible group however, as defined in section 384 of the Company Act 2006, the disclosure exemptions in respect of the financial statements for small companies have not been taken in the financial statements.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES AND BUSINESS REVIEW

Throughout the year, the principal activity of the Company has been that of a holding company. Details of the Company's operating subsidiaries and their activities are given in Note 6.

FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS

No change to the Company's activities is anticipated in 2015.

GOING CONCERN

The Company's ultimate parent undertaking is Prodrive (Holdings) Limited. The business operates under finance arrangements which principally comprise a third party bank debt facility, which matures on 31 August 2015 and shareholder loans due for repayment between 30 September 2015 and 31 December 2015 (together the "facilities"). The Group's principal shareholder has indicated to the Directors that, for a period at least until 31 December 2016, to the extent that funds are not otherwise available they will provide the financial support necessary to enable the Group to meet its liabilities as and when they fall due. Having considered this commitment and the available facilities alongside cash flow forecasts prepared for the Group which cover the same period, the Directors have concluded that it is appropriate for them to adopt a going concern basis for the preparation of the financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2014.

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS at 31 December 2014

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparation

The accounts are prepared under the historical cost convention, as amended for the revaluation of certain assets and in accordance with UK Generally Accepted Accounting Practice. The Company is exempt from preparing and delivering group accounts under S400 of the Companies Act 2006 (subsidiary undertaking of an EC parent). The financial statements present information about the Company as an individual undertaking and not of the group as a whole.

The Company's ultimate parent undertaking is Prodrive (Holdings) Limited. The business operates under finance arrangements which principally comprise a third party bank debt facility, which matures on 31 August 2015 and shareholder loans due for repayment between 30 September 2015 and 31 December 2015 (together the "facilities"). The Group's principal shareholder has indicated to the Directors that, for a period at least until 31 December 2016, to the extent that funds are not otherwise available they will provide the financial support necessary to enable the Group to meet its liabilities as and when they fall due. Having considered this commitment and the available facilities alongside cash flow forecasts prepared for the Group which cover the same period, the Directors have concluded that it is appropriate for them to adopt a going concern basis for the preparation of the financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2014.

Foreign currencies

Transactions expressed in foreign currencies have been translated into sterling at the rates of exchange approximating to those ruling at the date of the transactions. Monetary assets and liabilities have been translated at rates ruling at the balance sheet date. Exchange differences have been included in operating profit.

Cash flow statement

The cash flows of the Company for the year are included within the consolidated cash flow statement disclosed in the accounts of Prodrive (Holdings) Limited. In accordance with FRS1 (Revised), no cash flow statement is required in these accounts.

Investments

Fixed asset investments are stated at Directors valuation at the balance sheet date which for investment in subsidiary undertakings has been assessed by reference to the net asset position of the sub-group headed by the subsidiary undertaking to which the investment relates.

The surplus or deficit on revaluation is transferred to the revaluation reserve unless a deficit below original cost, or its reversal, occurs in which case it is recognised in the profit and loss account for the year. On the disposal of the investment any un-realised gain or loss that has been recognised within the revaluation reserve is realised through a movement in reserves.

2. OPERATING PROFIT/(LOSS)

The audit fee for the Company was borne by a parent undertaking in both years. No non-audit fees were incurred in either year.

3. DIRECTORS REMUNERATION

Deferred tax has been calculated at 20%, which is the rate expected to apply at the time at which timing differences are forecast to reverse, based on tax rates which have been substantively enacted at the balance sheet date.

The Company has tax losses carried forward of £541,000 (2013: £541,000). There is a potential deferred tax asset of £108,000 (2013: £108,000) in respect of these losses. The deferred tax asset has not been provided due to the uncertainty over the utilisation of these losses in the future.

5. TAX CREDIT (continued)

The UK Corporation tax rate fell from 23.25% for the year ended 31 December 2013 to 21.49% for the year ended 31 December 2014. The Corporation tax rate has fallen to 20% from 1 April 2015. It is not anticipated that the subsequent reduction to 20%, will have a material effect on the Company's future current or deferred tax charges.

20% of the ordinary share capital of Prodrive (Holdings) Limited is owned by Primewagon (Jersey) Limited. In addition to this share capital, Primewagon (Jersey) Limited also has an interest in Aston Martin Holdings (UK) Limited and its subsidiary Aston Martin Lagonda Limited.

During the year the Company entered into no transactions with Aston Martin Lagonda Limited and wholly owned subsidiaries of Hundred Percent Group Limited and there were no outstanding balances owed to or from the Company from these companies (2013: £Nil).
