The directors present their report and the financial statements of the company for the year ended 31 August 2020.

#### **Directors**

#### **Principal Activities**

Colfe's Leisure Centre is a subsidiary of Colfe's School. The school has a sports centre with a 25 metre swimming pool and a well-equipped gym, both of which can be used by members of Colfe's Leisure Services, when not in use by the school. A wide range of fitness classes are on offer to members as well as the general public. Hire of facility space such as an astro pitch and a small theatre space are also on offer. In more recent years, the expansion of the Colfe's Swim School has been a huge success and provides group and individual swimming lessons for all abilities. Any profit made by Colfe's Leisure Centre is paid as a gift aid payment to Colfe'school.

#### Results for the year to 31 August 2020

The results for the year to August 2020 are set out on page 7.

During the year, the Centre, like many, was impacted by the Coronavirus pandemic. The centre was closed at the end of March until it was partially reopened at the end of July, whereafter there were restrictions on the commercial operations of the Leisure Centre imposed by the government's Coronavirus guidance. The centre made a loss of £(1,893) before taxation and gift aid paid in respect of the prior year (2018/19; £83,418). All staff with the exception of management were furloughed during the period of closure and the Centre benefitted from a total of £138,790 in payments from the Coronavirus Job Retention Scheme (CJRS).

#### Directors' responsibilities statement

The directors are responsible for preparing the directors' report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and regulations.

Company law requires the directors to prepare financial statements for each financial year. Under that law the directors have elected to prepare the financial statements in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice (United Kingdom Accounting Standards and applicable law). - prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the company will continue in business.

#### Independent Auditor's Report to the Members of Colfe's Leisure Services Limited

#### **Opinion**

#### 3. Accounting policies (continued)

#### 1. General information

The company is a private company limited by shares, registered in England and Wales. The address of the registered office is Horn Park Lane, London, SE12 8AW, United Kingdom.

#### 2. Statement of compliance

These financial statements have been prepared in compliance with the provisions of Section 1A of FRS 102, 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland'.

#### 3. Accounting policies

#### Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis.

The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the entity, and rounded to the nearest pound.

The directors have at the time of approving the financial statements, a reasonable expectation that the company has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future, being at least 12 months from the date of signing the financial statements.

The impact of the Covid-19 pandemic has had an obvious adverse effect on the results for 2019/2 and the situation is on-going in 2020/21. Costs are being managed where possible and the centre continues to benefit from the CJRS, however, it is likely that the centre will be loss making in 2020/21. Reserves are sufficient to withstand the likely level of losses and the directors believe that the business will return to profitable trading in 2021/22. The directors therefore believe that the going concern basis of accounting continues to be appropriate in preparing the financial statements.

#### **Debtors**

Debtors are initially recorded at fair value and are assessed for impairment for each balance sheet date. If any impairments exist the debtors are re-measured to the present value of the expected future cash inflows.

#### Creditors

Creditors are initially recorded at fair value and are then re-measured to the present value of the expected future cash outflows.

No transitional adjustments were required in equity or the statement of comprehensive income.

#### Judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty

There are no significant estimates or assumptions made that have a significant risk of causing a material adjustment to the carrying amount of assets and liabilities within the next financial year.

#### Revenue recognition

Revenue refers to the revenue earned from the Company's principal activity; the provision of sports and leisure facilities and services and is recognised in the period in which the service is provided. Membership income relating to future periods is carried forward as deferred income within creditors.

The revenue shown in the statement of comprehensive income represents amounts invoiced during the year, exclusive of Value Added Tax.

#### 3. Accounting policies (continued)

Government grants are recognised on the accruals basis, when there is reasonable assurance that the School will comply with the conditions attaching to the grant and the grant will be received. The grant in connection to the job retention scheme has been recognised in the period to which the underlying furloughed staff costs relate to.

#### Income tax

The taxation expense represents the aggregate amount of current and deferred tax recognised in the reporting period. Tax is recognised in the statement of comprehensive income, except to the extent that it relates to items recognised in other comprehensive income or directly in equity. In this case, tax is recognised in other comprehensive income or directly in equity, respectively.

Current tax is recognised on taxable profit for the current and past periods. Current tax is measured at the amounts of tax expected to pay or recover using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted at the reporting date.

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences at the reporting date. Unrelieved tax losses and other deferred tax assets are recognised to the extent that it is probable that they will be recovered against the reversal of deferred tax liabilities or other future taxable profits. Deferred tax is measured using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the reporting date that are expected to apply to the reversal of the timing difference.

#### **Operating leases**

Rentals applicable to operating leases where substantially all of the benefits and risks of ownership remain with the lessor are charged against profits on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.

## Tangible assets

Expenditure on assets is capitalised if the asset is tangible and clearly has a useful economic life of 3 years or more.

#### Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost or valuation of an asset, less its residual value, over the useful economic life of that asset as follows:

Tennis Courts - 20% straight line
Plant & Machinery - 20% straight line
Office Equipment - 20% straight line
Computer Equipment - 33.3% Straight line

The residual value of all net assets is deemed to be £Nil.

#### Financial instruments

Financial instruments are classified and accounted for, according to the substance of the contractual arrangement, as either financial assets, financial liabilities or equity instruments. An equity instrument is any contract that evidences a residual interest in the assets of the company after deducting all of its liabilities.

#### **Defined contribution plans**

Contributions to defined contribution plans are recognised as an expense in the period in which the related

service is provided. Prepaid contributions are recognised as an asset to the extent that the prepayment will

lead to a reduction in future payments or a cash refund.

When contributions are not expected to be settled wholly within 12 months of the end of the reporting date in which the employees render the related service, the liability is measured on a discounted present value basis. The unwinding of the discount is recognised as a finance cost in the statement of income and retained earnings in the period in which it arises.
