NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2011

1. Accounting policies

1.1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention as modified by the revaluation of investment properties and in accordance with applicable accounting standards

1.2 Going concern

The company has adequate financial resources and as a consequence, the directors believe that the company is well placed to manage its business risks successfully. After making inquiries, the directors have a reasonable expectation that the company has adequate resources to continue in operational existence and meet its liabilities as they fall due for the foreseeable future. Accordingly, they continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the financial statements.

1.3 Cash flow

The company, being a subsidiary undertaking where 90% or more of the voting rights are controlled within the group whose consolidated financial statements are publicly available, is exempt from the requirement to draw up a cash flow statement in accordance with FRS 1

1.4 Turnover

Turnover represents rent receivable during the year It is stated at the fair value of the consideration receivable.

1.5 Investment properties

Investment properties are included in the balance sheet at their open market value in accordance with Statement of Standard Accounting Practice No 19 and are not depreciated. This treatment is contrary to the Companies Act 2006 which states that fixed assets should be depreciated but is, in the opinion of the directors, necessary in order to give a true and fair view of the financial position of the company.

1.6 Deferred taxation

Full provision is made for deferred tax assets and liabilities arising from all timing differences between the recognition of gains and losses in the financial statements and recognition in the tax computation except that deferred tax is not provided on timing differences arising from the revaluation of fixed assets in the financial statements unless by the balance sheet date the company had entered into a binding agreement to sell the revalued asset

A net deferred tax asset is recognised only if it can be regarded as more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are calculated using the tax rates enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date and which are expected to apply in the periods in which the timing differences are expected to reverse

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are not discounted

1.7 Financial instruments

Factors that may affect future tax charges

No provision has been made for deferred taxation of approximately £82,100 (2010 - £88,500) in respect of property valuations. The liability would only be recognised if the company was to enter into a binding sales agreement for the asset.

During the year, as a result of reductions in the UK main corporation tax rate to 26% with effect from 1 April 2011 and to 25% with effect from 1 April 2012, that were substantively enacted by the balance sheet date, the potential deferred tax balances have been re-measured

Further reductions to the UK corporation tax rate were announced in the March 2012 Budget. The changes, which are expected to be enacted separately each year, propose to reduce the rate to 24% by 1 April 2012 and 22% by 1 April 2014. Since these changes had not been substantively enacted at the balance sheet date they are not recognised in these financial statements.
