Directors' report for the year ended 31 March 2013

The directors submit their report and the audited financial statements of Albacom Holdings (the "Company") for the year ended 31 March 2013. The registered number of the Company is 2603349.

The directors' report has been prepared in accordance with the special provisions relating to small companies within Part 15 of the Companies Act.

Principal activities and future developments

The Company acts as a holding company for companies providing telecommunications and related services in Italy. The directors do not anticipate any change in the Company's principal activity in the foreseeable future.

Principal risks and uncertainties

The directors of BT Group plc (the ultimate controlling entity of the Company) manage the group's risks at a group level, rather than at an individual business unit level. For this reason, the Company's directors believe that a discussion of the group's risks would not be appropriate for an understanding of the development, performance or position of the Company's business. The principal risks and uncertainties of BT Group plc, which include those of the company, are discussed on pages 23 to 27 of 2013 annual report of BT Group plc, which does not form part of this report.

Key performance indicators ("KPIs")

The directors of BT Group plc manage the group's operations on a divisional basis. For this reason, the Company's directors believe that analysis using key performance indicators for the Company is not necessary or appropriate for an understanding of the development, performance or position of the business of the Company.

Results and dividends

The loss on ordinary activities before taxation was £133,211,109 (2012: £18,203,315). The tax credit on loss on ordinary activities was £1,010,666 (2012: £4,732,862) which left a loss after taxation for the year of £132,200,443 (2012: £13,470,453).

The directors do not recommend the payment of a dividend in respect of the year ended 31 March 2013 (2012: £nil).

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Accounting policies

Basis of accounting

The financial statements are prepared on the going concern basis, under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Companies Act 2006 and applicable accounting standards in the United Kingdom. The principal accounting policies, which have been consistently applied, are set out below

The financial statements present information about the Company as an individual undertaking, and not about its group. The Company is exempt by virtue of s400 of the Companies Act 2006 from the requirement to prepare and deliver group accounts as the accounts of Albacom Holdings are consolidated in the financial statements of BT Group plc, the ultimate parent entity

The preparation of financial statements requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of income and expenditure during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates. Estimates are used principally when accounting for investment impairment, provisions for liabilities and charges and taxes

Investments

Investments are carried at cost less provision for impairment. Investments are tested for impairment when an event that might affect asset values has occurred. An impairment loss is recognised to the extent that the carrying amount cannot be recovered either by selling the asset or by the discounted future cash flows from the investment.

Foreign currencies

Trading transactions denominated in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the exchange rate ruling when the transaction was entered into. Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the exchange rate ruling at the balance sheet date. Exchange gains or losses are dealt with through the profit and loss account

Exchange gains and losses on foreign currency borrowings used to finance or provide a hedge against investments in foreign undertakings are taken to reserves and reported in the statement of total recognised gains and losses (where applicable)

Accounting policies (continued)**Taxation**

The charge for taxation is based on the loss for the year and takes into account deferred tax.

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date, where transactions or events that result in an obligation to pay more tax in the future or a right to pay less tax in the future have occurred at the balance sheet date.

A net deferred tax asset is recognised as recoverable and therefore recognised only when, on the basis of all available evidence, it can be regarded as more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits against which to recover carried forward tax losses and from which the future reversal of underlying timing differences can be deducted

Deferred tax is measured at the average tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which the timing differences are expected to reverse, based on tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date. Deferred tax is measured on an undiscounted basis

Cash flow statement

The Company is a wholly-owned subsidiary of BT Group plc. The cash flows of the Company are included in the consolidated cash flow statement of BT Group plc, whose annual report is publicly available. Consequently the Company is exempt under the terms of FRS 1 "Cash Flow Statements" from publishing a cash flow statement
