1 Accounting policies

Basis of preparation

Allmat (East Surrey) Limited is a company incorporated and domiciled in the UK.

The Company is exempt by virtue of s400 subject to the small companies regime of the Companies Act 2006 from the requirement to prepare group financial statements. These financial statements present information about the Company as an individual undertaking and not about its group.

These financial statements were prepared in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 101 Reduced Disclosure Framework ("FRS 101"). The amendments to FRS 101 (2014/15 Cycle) issued in July 2015 and effective immediately have been applied.

In preparing these financial statements, the Company applies the recognition, measurement and disclosure requirements of International Financial Reporting Standards as adopted by the EU ("Adopted IFRSs"), but makes amendments where necessary in order to comply with Companies Act 2006 and has set out below where advantage of the FRS 101 disclosure exemptions has been taken.

On conversion to FRS 101, the company has applied IFRS 1 whilst ensuring that its assets and liabilities are measured in compliance with FRS 101. The company has made an adjustment to deferred tax on conversion relating to the reclassification of plant and equipment. The conversion note can be seen on page 17 of these financial statements.

The Company's ultimate parent undertaking, Sumisho Osaka Gas Water UK Ltd includes the Company in its consolidated financial statements. The consolidated financial statements of Sumisho Osaka Gas Water UK Ltd are prepared in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards and are available to the public and may be obtained from Vintners' Place, 68 Upper Thames Street, London EC4V 3BJ. Company financial statements have been prepared and approved by the directors in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards as adopted by the EU ("Adopted IFRSs").

In these financial statements, the company has applied the exemptions available under FRS 101 in respect of the following disclosures:

- a cash flow statement and related notes;
- comparative period reconciliations for share capital and tangible fixed assets;
- disclosures in respect of capital management; and
- the effects of new but not yet effective IFRSs.

The Company proposes to continue to adopt the reduced disclosure framework of FRS 101 in its next financial statements.

The accounting policies set out below have, unless otherwise stated, been applied consistently to all periods presented in these financial statements and in preparing an opening FRS 101 IFRS balance sheet at 01 April 2015 for the purposes of the transition to FRS 101.

Judgements made by the directors, in the application of these accounting policies that have significant effect on the financial statements and estimates with a significant risk of material adjustment in the next year are discussed in note 15.

Turnover

Turnover represents the amount (excluding value added tax) receivable from the provision of goods and services to customers.

Notes

(Basis of preparation continued)

Leases

Operating lease rentals are charged to the profit and loss account on a straight-line basis over the period of the lease.

Taxation

Tax on the profit or loss for the year comprises current and deferred tax. Tax is recognised in the profit and loss account except to the extent that it relates to items recognised directly in equity or other comprehensive income, in which case it is recognised directly in equity or other comprehensive income.

Current tax is the expected tax payable or receivable on the taxable income or loss for the year, using tax rates enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date, and any adjustment to tax payable in respect of previous years.

Deferred tax is provided on temporary differences between the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities for financial reporting purposes and the amounts used for taxation purposes. The following temporary differences are not provided for: the initial recognition of goodwill; the initial recognition of assets or liabilities that affect neither accounting nor taxable profit other than in a business combination, and differences relating to investments in subsidiaries to the extent that they will probably not reverse in the foreseeable future. The amount of deferred tax provided is based on the expected manner of realisation or settlement of the carrying amount of assets and liabilities, using tax rates enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date.

A deferred tax asset is recognised only to the extent that it is probable that future taxable profits will be available against which the temporary difference can be utilised.

Dividends

Dividends are only recognised as a liability to the extent that they are declared prior to the year end. Unpaid dividends that do not meet these criteria are disclosed in the notes to the Financial Statements.

Fixed assets and depreciation

Depreciation is provided by the Company to write off the cost less the estimated residual value of tangible fixed assets by equal instalments over their estimated useful economic lives as follows:

Plant and Machinery - 4 - 20 years
Fixtures & fittings - 4 - 20 years
Motor vehicles - 4 - 10 years
Office equipment - 4 - 20 years

Stocks

Stocks are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value, provision having been made for any slow moving or obsolete stock where this is considered necessary. Cost is determined on a last price paid basis.

Pension costs

The Company offers a Group Personal Pension Plan and a Money Purchase Plan to employees. The amount charged against profits represents the contributions payable to these schemes.

Going concern

The Directors have considered the company's assets and liabilities as at the date of signing these accounts, and have concluded that the company will continue to be able to meet its liabilities for at least twelve months from the date of signature of these accounts. A going concern basis has therefore been adopted.

Reductions in the UK corporation tax rate from 23% to 21% (effective from 1 April 2014) and 20% (effective from 1 April 2015) were substantively enacted on 2 July 2013. Further reductions to 19% (effective from 1 April 2017) and to 18% (effective 1 April 2020) were substantively enacted on 26 October 2015. The deferred tax liability at 31 March 2016 has been calculated based on these rates.

Notes (taxation continued)

An additional reduction to 17% (effective from 1 April 2020) was announced in the Budget on 16 March 2016. This will reduce the company's future current tax charge accordingly and reduce the deferred tax liability at 31 March 2016 by £220

The deferred tax asset at 31 March 2016 has been calculated based on the rate of 20% substantively enacted at the balance sheet date.

Factors affecting the tax charge for the current year

The current tax charge for the year is lower (2015: higher) than the standard rate of corporation tax in the UK of 20% (2015: 21%). The differences are explained below.
