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# DIRECTORS REPORT

The directors submit their report and accounts for the year ended 30 June 1999, and confirm that they comply with current statutory requirements, and with the requirements of the Trust's governing instrument.

The Sick Dentist Trust is a company limited by guarantee, and is incorporated in England. The company's registered office is c/o Dentists Provident Society, 9 Gayfere Street, Westminster, SW1P 3HN.

#### CHANGE OF NAME

The charitable company changed its name to The Dentists' Health Support Trust on 21 September 1999.

#### CHARITABLE STATUS

The company is a registered charity, (number 1003819).

#### **GOVERNING INSTRUMENT**

The governing instrument is the Memorandum and Articles of Association. The society is governed by the Trustees. The principal officers are Mr. A. H. Chivers MBE (Chairman) and Mr. D. J. Mehigan (Treasurer & Secretary).

#### PRINCIPAL ACTIVITY

The objective of the Trust is to provide funding for identification, advice, support, and information; and to promote awareness of the problems of drug and alcohol abuse in the dental profession. It acts as a support for the British Dental Association's management group of the General Dental Services Committee, on which it has representation.

The Trust appeals to the profession for funds to finance its work, which has public benefit, in the early detection and subsequent support for affected practitioners. The Trust meets the loss of earnings and expenses of Special Referees, who are registered dental surgeons, so designated because of their particular experience in addiction. A policy of education of Special Referees is operated, by supporting their training, and a limited number have attended the summer courses of the University of Utah School of Addiction in the U.S.

A widely advertised telephone helpline is manned on a 24 hour basis, and there is a current project to produce a manual similar to the American publication "Dentistry Faces Addiction", with the aim to provide a copy to all practising dentists.

The country has been divided into nine regions each with a coordinating Special Referee, under the supervision of a National Coordinator, who is the principal point of contact for those seeking help, and the majority of all work devolves to him in practice. The aim is to build a national network of trained Special Referees, supported by Regional Referees from the profession, also trained, allowing the Coordinator more time to develop the Scheme.

The Dentist's Provident Society provides some secretarial services and office space free of charge, for the Trust's officers to carry out the administration. This is the statutory documentation, meetings administration, educational meetings support, payment of claims and acknowledgment of donations together with associated banking. There are no donations in kind

The trustees expenses are minimal and their work unpaid.

#### REVIEW OF THE YEAR

Donations received rose slightly from £55,218 to £55,419 (see pages 8-9), despite the cessation of the three year grant of £12,000 from the Department of Health, was has expired. The Trust's bank deposits produced interest of £5,743 in a year of decreasing interest rates. Direct charitable expenses, (Special Referees expenses), fell to £55,908, and included support to dental members of the Doctors' and Dentists' Group who are special referees. Other events included training days for Regional and Special Referees. There was no annual trip to the University of Utah School of Addiction, but a training symposium is planned for the coming year, when teachers (lecturers) from America will come to Britain for a three day teach-in, for education of invited professionals from the Veterinary, Pharmaceutical, Medical and Dental profession, and update training of the participating special and regional referees, as may be invited. During the year to March 1999, 47 new cases were identified, and ongoing support and monitoring of current known problems took place, according to need.

The Directors consider the Trust's financial position to be sound, and a contingency reserve of £40,000 (equal to the running expenses of an average year) is to be carried forward.
