STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Legal entity

The company is governed by its memorandum and articles of association. The members' liability in respect of the guarantee, as set out in the memorandum and articles of association, is limited to £1 per guarantor. There are 3 members.

Organisation

Management is performed by members of the council.

Risk management

The trustees have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, in particular those related to the operations and finance of the Trust, and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate their exposure to major risks.

OBJECTS AND ACTIVITIES

The principal objective of the company is that of the advancement of the education of the public in the history of steam locomotives, in particular the restoration and preservation for the benefit of the public of Steam Locomotives.

In order to pursue its objectives, the charity has purchased an engine which it intends to restore.

In shaping the objectives for the year and planning activities, the trustees have considered the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit, including the guidance on public benefit and fee charging. The Locomotive is currently available for inspection by appointment.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

The trust has continued to concentrate its resources on the contract overhaul of its 'Peckett' 0-4-0 Saddle Tank Locomotive No. 2111, built in Bristol in 1949. The engine had been stored, out of service since 1996, requiring a comprehensive mechanical and boiler overhaul, and major upgrades to its braking and lubrication systems. The work began in the spring of 2012 at the West Shed site of the Princess Royal Class Locomotive Trust, near Ripley, Derbyshire.

In May 2016 Tyseley Locomotive Works advised that all of the subcontracted boiler work for which they were responsible, had been completed. Following a successful hydraulic test, a fire had been lit on the grate, and the extensively repaired boiler was gradually brought up to its maximum pressure in the presence of the Insurance Company's boiler inspector. We understand that the whole of the statutory testing procedure was satisfactorily completed without the need for remedial work of any kind, a testament to the quality of the workmanship. Early the following month, the boiler was delivered back to West Shed, and place directly onto the locomotive's frames. In the meantime the mechanical repairs and renewals had also progressed. By the end of the period under review, the following element of work had been substantially completed:-

- Design and fabrication of the lubricator drive mechanism, and delivery pipework.
- Valve gear and pistons refurbished and reassembled to the cylinders.
- Brake rigging repaired and reassembled.
- Platework repairs to the saddle tank, cab and coal bunker.
- Springs repaired and re-fitted.
- Pattern produced, and a quantity of new firebars cast.
- New boiler pressure gauge obtained.
- Driver's brake valve rebuilt

In addition to the above, work was well under way on the design and fitting of the new, automatic braking system, with its associated pipework, necessary for the working of passenger trains. The re-assembly of the smokebox and its internals, with new angle ring and some new steel platework had also commenced.

In February 2016 a further sum was drawn down from the Trust's interest-bearing Business Bond to provide for the Peckett's ongoing overhaul. The balance was reinvested for a further 12 months. No further donations to deserving causes within the heritage railway sector have been made during the period under review.

Financial review

The surplus for the year has been added to reserves brought forward.

Reserves policy

Following the disposal a few years since of the main locomotive held by the charity there are still substantial unrestricted reserves at the year end. It is the trustees' intention to restore another locomotive and to make grants to other deserving causes in the steam heritage sector where the outcome will meet the Trust's objectives.

Investment policy

The council members have considered the most appropriate policy for investing funds and have found that a building society or bank deposit account together with some short-term investment bonds meets their requirements.

COUNCIL MEMBERS' RESPONSIBILITIES

Under company law the council members have the same legal responsibilities as company directors and the title is interchangeable.

Company law requires the directors to prepare accounts for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the company and of the profit or loss of the company for that year. In preparing those accounts the directors are required to select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently; make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; follow applicable accounting standards, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the accounts; and prepare the accounts on a going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the company will continue in business.

The directors are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the company and to enable them to ensure that the accounts comply with the Companies Act 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

ACCOUNTANTS

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The financial statements of the charitable company have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRSSE) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (the FRSSE) (effective January 2015)', the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2015) and the Companies Act 2006. The Financial Statements have been prepared under the historical costs convention.

Cash flow

The accounts do not include a cash flow statement because the company, as a small reporting entity, is exempt from the requirement to prepare such a statement under Financial Reporting Standard 1 'Cash flow statements'.

Income

Income is brought into the accounts on the accruals basis.

Expenditure

Expenditure is brought into the accounts when incurred on the accruals basis.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life:-

Locomotives - 10% on cost Computers - 331/3 on cost

However where the locomotives are still in the process of being restored no depreciation is provided.

Consolidation

The company is exempt by Section 383 of the Companies Act 2006 from the requirement to prepare group accounts.

Taxation

The company is a registered charity and is entitled to exemptions from tax to the extent that income received falls within Section 505 I.C.T.A. 1988 and Section 256 C.G.T.A. 1992 and is applied to charitable purposes only.
