Directors' report

The directors present their report and financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2010

Principal activity and review of the business

In 2010, the main activities of the company continued to be the licensing of film and television rights. Nevertheless, the company has been and will be more and more involved in the UK production of films.

The revenues for the year amounted to \$21 2m (2009 \$22 1m) Revenues in 2010 showed a slight decrease compared to 2009 new production revenues have partially compensated the decrease of TV and video sales

After taking into account a \$0 2m foreign exchange loss (2009 \$0 2m foreign exchange gain), the operating profit for the year amounted to \$3 5m (2009 \$6 4m) This variation is mainly explained by the increase in cost of sales. This is due to the amortisation of investments in film licensing rights generated through the Company's involvement in the UK production of film.

The directors do not recommend a dividend for the year ended 31 December 2010 (2009 Snil)

Future developments

The directors expect continued further development of the company's business in the forthcoming year in the licensing and in the production of films

"Brighton rock" directed by Rowan Joffe is the first movie coming from Canal + Image UK production and was released after the year end on 4 February 2011

Financial risk management

The company's operations expose it to financial risks that include the effects of changes in exchange rates and interest rates. The policies set by StudioCanal SA, the company's parent undertaking to prevent those risks are implemented by the directors of the company.

Notes

(forming part of the financial statements)

1 Accounting policies

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the company's financial statements, except as noted below

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards and under the historical cost accounting rules

The company is exempt by virtue of s 400 of the Companies Act 2006 from the requirement to prepare group accounts as the company is included in the consolidated accounts of a larger group headed by Vivendi S A, a parent undertaking established under the law of a member state of the European Union These financial statements present information about the company as an individual undertaking and not about its group

Under Financial Reporting Standard ("FRS") 1 the company is exempt from the requirement to prepare a cash flow statement on the grounds that it is a wholly owned subsidiary of Vivendi S A which includes the company in its own published consolidated financial statements

As the company is a wholly owned subsidiary of Vivendi S A, the company has taken advantage of the exemption contained in FRS 8 and has therefore not disclosed transactions or balances with wholly owned entities which form part of the group (or investees of the group qualifying as related parties) The consolidated financial statements of Vivendi S A, within which this company is included, can be obtained from the address given in note 17

Going Concern

No material uncertainties that cast significant doubt about the ability of the company to continue as a going concern have been identified by the directors

The company's business activities, together with the factors likely to affect its future development, performance and position are set out in the Business Review on page 2

The company has considerable financial resources together with long-term contracts with a number of customers and suppliers across different geographic areas and industries. StudioCanal S.A., the company's immediate parent undertaking, has formally confirmed that it will provide financial support to the company for the foreseeable future and for a period of not less than the next twelve months from the date of approval of these accounts.

As a consequence, the directors believe that the company is well placed to manage its business risks successfully despite the current uncertain economic outlook

The directors have a reasonable expectation that the company has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Thus they continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the annual financial statements.

Turnover

Turnover comprises the value of sales (excluding VAT and trade discounts) in the normal course of business Turnover from direct sales of licenses to customers is recognised on the later of delivery of rights or the start of the license period. Turnover from sales through distributors is recognised upon notification of amounts receivable.

Turnover also comprises revenues from the production of films, including from the sale of distribution rights, public agency subsidies and financing presales, recognised when the company has the right to the income

The directors have not disclosed the segmental analysis of turnover on the grounds that it would be seriously prejudicial against the interests of the company

Accounting policies (continued)

Intangible fixed assets

The cost of acquired film licensing rights is capitalised and amortised on a straight line basis over their expected useful economic life, not exceeding 20 years. The cost of film licensing rights generated through the Company's involvement in the UK production of films is capitalised and amortised in accordance with the revenue generated in the period in proportion to the total expected revenue. Amortisation charges are expensed as a cost of sale

Tangible fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets are shown at cost less accumulated depreciation

Depreciation is provided to write off the cost less the estimated residual value of tangible fixed assets by equal instalments over their estimated useful economic lives, as follows

Film masters

5 years 5 - 10 years

Plant and machinery Fixtures and fittings

10 years

Investments

Fixed asset investments are shown at cost less provisions for permanent diminution in value

Taxation

The charge/(credit) for taxation is based on the profit/(loss) for the year and takes into account taxation deferred because of the timing differences between the treatment of certain items for taxation and accounting purposes

Deferred tax is recognised without discounting, in respect of all timing differences between the treatment of certains items for taxation and accounting purposes which have arisen but not reversed by the balance sheet date, except as otherwise required by FRS 19

Timing differences are differences between the company's taxable profit and loss and its results as stated in the financial statements. No deferred tax is recognised on permanent differences

Deferred tax is measured at the average tax rates that are expected to apply in the period in which the timing differences are expected to reverse, based on tax rates and law that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date. Deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent that it is considered more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted

Operating leases

Operating lease rentals are charged to the profit and loss account on a straight-line basis over the term of the lease period

Foreign currency

These financial statements are prepared in US dollars which is the functional currency of the company

Transactions denominated in foreign currencies are recorded using the rate of exchange ruling at the date of the transaction. Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated using the contracted rate or the rate of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date and the gains and losses on translation are included in the profit and loss account.

Pension

The company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. The assets of the scheme are held separately from those of an independently administered fund. The amount charged to the profit and loss account represents contributions payable to the scheme in respect of the accounting period.

The UK Government has announced a phased reduction in the main UK corporation tax rate from 28% to 23%, with the first 1% reduction taking effect from 1 April 2011 (and substantively enacted on 20 July 2010). A further 2% has been substantively enacted during 2011 to date. Deferred tax assets and liabilities are measured at the rate that is expected to apply to the period when the asset is realised or the liability is settled, based on the rates that have been enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date. Therefore, at 31 December 2010, deferred tax assets and liabilities have been calculated based on a rate of 27%, where the temporary difference is expected to reverse after 1 April 2011.
