The directors present their report and the financial statements for the year ended 31 July 2011

#### **DIRECTORS' RESPONSIBILITIES STATEMENT**

The directors are responsible for preparing the Directors' report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and regulations

Company law requires the directors to prepare financial statements for each financial year. # **PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES**

The principal activities of the company are the management of a sports complex and the commercial letting of Headington School premises throughout the year but mainly during holiday periods

Turnover for the year was £311,746 compared to £304,474 in the previous year. The financial statements show a profit of £89,062 (2010 profit of £303,982). The company made a gift aid donation of £82,419 (2010 £57,433) to the School, with the result that it has a nil annual corporation tax liability.

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

# 1.1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008)

# 1.2 Going concern

After making enquiries, the directors have a reasonable expectation that the company has adequate resources to continue its activities for the forseeable future. Accordingly, they continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the financial statements as outlined in the Statement of Directors' Responsibilities on page 1.

#### 1.3 Cash flow

The company, being a subsidiary undertaking where 90% or more of the voting rights are controlled within the group whose consolidated financial statements are publicly available, is exempt from the requirement to draw up a cash flow statement in accordance with FRS 1

#### 1.4 Turnover

Turnover comprises revenue recognised by the company in respect of goods and services supplied during the year, exclusive of Value Added Tax and trade discounts

## 1.5 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost of fixed assets, less their estimated residual value, over their expected useful lives on the following bases.
