At the balance sheet date the amount due from Starfisch Records Ltd, a fellow group undertaking, was £2,054,308 (2011 £1,816,878) During the year £237,430 was transferred to Starfisch Records Ltd as an interest free group loan repayable on demand

At the balance sheet date the amount due to/(from) Barco holdings Ltd, the company's parent undertaking was £1,426,147 (2011 (£10,143)) this amount is an interest free group loan repayable on demand

At 30 September 2008 Barco Holdings Ltd entered into a loan agreement with Ingenious Resources Ltd for a loan of £1,279,821. The money received was then loaned to Barco Sales Ltd to assist with the funding of the investment in Big Screen Productions 4 LLP. The loan is repayable on the earlier of the winding up of Big Screen Productions 4 LLP, the sale of its assets, termination of its operators agreements or 30 September 2016. The intercompany loan is shown in long term creditors in note 15. A tranche of the loan of £54,254, of which £45,027 was repaid from the first drawings from Big Screen Productions 4 LLP leaving £9,227 disclosed in loans repayable within 1 year. The balance of the loan is due for payment within two - five years of the balance sheet date. The loan shown in Barco Holdings Ltd secured on the company's investment in Big Screen Productions 4 LLP. The loans accrues interest at 2 percent above bank base rate. Interest payable to Ingenious Resources Ltd by Barco Holdings Ltd and consequently payable by Barco Sales Ltd to Barco Holdings Ltd for the year ended 30 September 2012 was £30,866 (2011 £50,955). This was paid directly out of Barco Sales Ltd investment income to Ingenious Resources Ltd on behalf of Barco Holdings Ltd as per the notice of assignment of Interest.
