## Notes to the Abbreviated Accounts Year ended 30 June 2005

## Accounting policies

## (a) Accounting convention

The accounts are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards.

#### (b) Turnover

Turnover represents the amount of fees receivable during the year, exclusive of VAT.

#### (c) Finance costs of debt

The finance costs of debt, including interest and issue costs, are allocated to each period over the term of the debt and charged to the profit and loss account at a constant rate on the outstanding amount.

#### (d) Depreciation

Depreciation of tangible fixed assets is provided on cost over their estimated useful lives. The annual rates and methods of depreciation are as follows:-

Fixtures, fittings & equipment Motor vehicles

20% straight line basis 20% straight line basis

#### (e) Leases

Operating lease rentals are charged to the profit and loss account as incurred.

#### (f) Work in progress

Work in progress is valued at the direct cost of labour and materials with the addition of an appropriate proportion of overhead expenses.

# (g) Pensions

The company has a defined contribution pension scheme. The pension costs charged to the profit and loss account are the premiums payable in respect of the accounting period.

## (h) Deferred tax

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed by the balance sheet date. Deferred tax is not recognised when assets are revalued unless, by the balance sheet date, the company has entered into a binding agreement to sell the assets and recognised the gains or losses expected to arise on sale.

#### (i) Group accounts

The accounts present information about the company as an individual undertaking and not about its group. The company has not prepared group accounts as it is exempt from the requirement to do so by section 228 of the Companies Act 1985 as it is a subsidiary undertaking of C. S. L Surveys Holdings Limited, a company incorporated in England.

#### (j) Cash flow statement

The company qualifies as a small company under the Companies Act 1985. The director has elected to take advantage of the exemption under FRS1 not to prepare a cash flow statement.
