REPORT OF THE DIRECTORS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST JULY 2006

The directors present their report with the accounts of the company for the year ended 31st July 2006.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITY

The principal activity of the company in the year under review was that of rose breeding and wholesaling and plant centre operation.

REVIEW OF BUSINESS

The results for the year and financial position of the company are as shown in the annexed accounts.

The company has continued to perform well in a difficult climate with growth achieved in many areas of the business. Overall turnover increased to £4,835k from £4,754k with gross margins being retained at 45%. Although the directors anticipate the market will become increasingly competitive they are confident that the strong brand along with a targeted promotional strategy will ensure continued growth.

The company remains committed to investing heavily in the research and development of new varieties through its extensive breeding programme which, it sees as the foundation of its success. Total research and development costs were £582k.

In addition the company has been successful in improving efficiencies throughout its business. This has enabled labour costs to be controlled, total labour costs, excluding directors remuneration, including social security being £1,535k in 2005 compared to £1,479 in the previous year.

Total profits before tax was £371k increased from a break even position in 2005, 2005 including substantial costs of expanding into new markets.

DIVIDENDS

An interim dividend of £20 per share was paid on 11th May 2006. The directors recommend that no final dividend be paid.

The total distribution of dividends for the year ended 31st July 2006 will be £152,000.

RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT

The company continues to breed roses and develop new strains.

FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS

The company continues to undertake significant expenditure on fixed assets to promote future growth and efficiency.

ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Turnover

1.

Turnover represents the net amount invoiced by the company for goods and services excluding value added tax.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life or, if held under a finance lease, over the lease term, whichever is the shorter.

Freehold property

- 1% straight line

Equipment and fixtures

- 25% on reducing balance

Motor vehicles

- 25% on reducing balance

Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items.

Deferred tax

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date.

Hire purchase and leasing commitments

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to the profit and loss account on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.

Pensions

The company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable for the year are charged in the profit and loss account.

Foreign currencies

Assets and liabilities in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. Transactions in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rates of exchange ruling at the date of transaction. This is except for transactions made through foreign currency bank accounts which are translated at the rates ruling when transfers are made to sterling accounts or at the balance sheet date, whichever is the earlier. Exchange differences are taken into account in arriving at the operating result.

Research and Development

The company is engaged in propagating with a view to creating further marketable varieties. The company's policy is not to capitalise and carry forward costs incurred due to the highly speculative nature of the work.

Group accounts

The company is the parent of a medium sized group and is therefore exempt from the requirement to prepare group accounts. The financial statements include information on transactions of the parent undertaking only and not about its group.

The benefit of group relief is accounted for within the tax charge of the profit making undertaking. No payment is made for group relief between group undertakings.

At the 31st July 2006 £841,338 was owed to David Austin Rose Nursery Limited (2005 £292,847), shown as group undertakings in note 11.
