The executive committee (who are directors and trustees of the charitable company) present their report together with the audited financial statements for the year ended 30 April 1996.

Principal activity

The company is limited by guarantee (company number 2705833) and governed by a memorandum and articles of association. It is registered by the Charity Commission as charity number 1010740 and is principally engaged in furthering the purpose of the Women's Institute movement in Northamptonshire and elsewhere.

Business Review

The net incoming resources for the year amounted to £2,278 as shown on page 4. The Federation is dependent upon the individual Institutes to provide the income of the charity either through the support of the events organised by the Federation and also by the purchase of a varied selection of books and other articles for sale supplied by national and county suppliers.

The Federation is staffed by three part-time workers who deal with all secretarial and administration duties of the Federation as well as assisting on an ad hoc basis with the activities provided. The Federation's balance sheet as detailed on page 5 shows members' funds amounting to £75,925 which is thought by the executive committee to be satisfactory.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 1996

1 Accounting policies

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost accounting rules and in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice for charities ('The Charities SORP').

The company has taken advantage of the exemption from preparing a cash flow statement conferred by Financial Reporting Standard No. 1 on the grounds that it is entitled to the exemptions available in Sections 246 and 247 of the Companies Act 1985 for small companies.

Incoming resources

Income received for a specific restricted purpose is credited to a separate restricted fund which is shown in a note to the financial statements.

Total incoming resources credited to restricted funds are disclosed in the statement of financial activities, which also shows incoming resources in respect of unrestricted funds.

Donations and affiliation fees are credited on the statement of financial activities in the year to which they relate.

Resources expended

Expenditure is allocated on the statement of financial activities between restricted funds and unrestricted funds, and is further analysed between direct charitable expenditure, fund-raising and publicity, and management and administration costs.

Depreciation

Depreciation of fixed assets is calculated to write off their cost or valuation less any residual value over their estimated useful lives as follows:
