### TRUSTEES' REPORT for the year ended 31 March 2013

The trustees, who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act, submit their annual report and the audited financial statements of the National Youth Advocacy Service (the charity) for the year ended 31 March 2012. The trustees confirm that the annual report and financial statements of the charity comply with current statutory requirements, the requirements of the charity's governing document and the provisions of the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" issued in March 2005.

#### STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

#### a. Constitution

The charity is registered as a charitable company limited by guarantee and was set up by a Trust deed on 10 June 1992

The charity is constituted under a Trust deed dated 10 June 1992 and is a registered charity number 1012485

Governance is the responsibility of the Board of Trustees working closely with the Chief Executive and operating within the terms of our Memorandum and Articles of Association. The Board of Trustees follows a routine of closely monitoring and reviewing its effectiveness at its quarterly meetings and through careful application of any advice contained within the management letter provided as part of the annual audit

We seek to ensure that the Board of Trustees continually comprises of individuals who contribute a range of skills and expertise which are relevant to the monitoring, guidance and development of the National Youth Advocacy Service. We are particularly fortunate to have trustees who bring financial, commercial, legal and social work together with extensive academic knowledge and experience.

#### b. Method of appointment or election of trustees

Appointment of trustees follows a skills audit which we conduct periodically, so that any gaps in the Board of Trustees' expertise can be addressed. The appointment process is initiated through our established network of business, legal, voluntary and academic sector contacts and through a process of formal recruitment.

Potential trustees with the appropriate expertise and experience are given the opportunity to meet the Chair, the Chief Executive and other Board of Trustee members, and to visit the Charity Headquarters or services which may be local to them. Appointment is made after attendance at a full meeting of the Board of Trustees and when the candidate has had the opportunity to confirm their commitment to the work and values of the charity and their capability to devote appropriate time to it. A full consensus must be achieved by the Board of Trustees.

#### c. Policies adopted for the induction and training of trustees

New trustees are provided with an induction pack containing background information about the work of the Charity and a copy of the NCVO's 'Good Trustee Guide'. An induction programme is matched to their individual needs and may comprise discussion of a range of documentation such as the most recent annual report and accounts, current financial records and accounting systems, organisational structure charts, young people's feedback reports and operating practices. Induction and on-going trustee training can include time spent at NYAS' operational centres in Birkenhead or Birmingham, and trustees are offered the opportunity to participate in any of the current training programmes delivered by the NYAS Training Team

#### d. Organisational structure and decision making

The Chief Executive and the Senior Management Team report regularly to the Board of Trustees Operational management decisions are made by the Chief Executive with the support of her Senior Management Team

Staff appointments at director level and above are made by the Board of Trustees and strategic policy decisions are referred to them. The Board is grateful to the Professional Advisory Group for support in formulating policy

The Board of Trustees is responsible for the preparation of financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the company as at the balance sheet date and of its incoming resources and application of resources, including income and expenditure for the year ended. The Board of Trustees is responsible for safeguarding the assets of the company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud or other irregularities.

#### e Risk management

The Board of Trustees has examined the major strategic business and operational risks which the National Youth Advocacy Service faces and confirm that policies, procedures and systems have been established so that the necessary steps can be taken to manage those risks and to enable regular reports to be provided. The board reviews high level risks and the action to taken to manage these risks quarterly

The trustees continue to be aware of the uncertainty caused by cuts in public spending and the challenges arising from changes to legal aid funding. We are responding responsibly by managing contracts robustly, introducing efficiency savings and growing alternative sources of funding.

The Charity remains firmly committed to the mission of ensuring that children, young people and vulnerable adults are able to understand and influence decisions made about their lives

#### **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

#### a Policies and objectives

Our mission statement is "A society where every child, young person and vulnerable adult's voice is heard and their rights are respected and where they can achieve their potential"

- •To provide a range of independent, confidential information, advice, advocacy and legal services for children, young people and vulnerable adults
- •To ensure children, young people and vulnerable adults are empowered to make informed and free choices and to speak for themselves

- 3 Our community care, public law and education legal services strengthened the support we offered children and young people as well as enabling us to support vulnerable adults
- 4 In Wales we have ten commissioned services and have been instrumental in providing the specialist advocacy qualification in children/young people to the voluntary and statutory sector in Wales. This training ensures the advocacy sector achieves a standard of professionalism and recognition.
- 5 We continue to provide specialist advocacy training across England and Wales
- 6 We expanded our successful separating parents information programme and 240 adults attended the programme in the year, an increase of more than 40% over the previous year
- "I found the programme informative and helpful and really hope that the things I learnt and saw today can help me and my ex co-operate in the future to reduce conflict completely"
- 7 We provided separate representation and a guardian for 169 children in private law family proceedings

#### b. Investment policy and performance

In addition to the aim to retain a prudent amount of reserves each year, the charity's funds have generally been required to be spent in the short term. The investment policy therefore has been to balance liquidity and the availability of funds whist ensuring an appropriate level of return on the investment. Brewin Dolphin acts as the Charity's independent investment provider, managing the performance of the charity's fixed assets investments. Further liquid funds remain in easy access bank accounts.

#### **FINANCIAL REVIEW**

#### a Reserves policy

The statement of financial activities, as set out on page 11 shows that the free reserves of the charity have fallen during the year from £2,135,963 as at 31 March 2012 to £1,960,333 as at 31 March 2013 Free reserves are calculated as total unrestricted funds, less designated funds, tangible assets and investment properties but

include fixed asset investments. The net movement in funds is offset by a reduction in designated reserves

It is the aim of the trustees and the Chief Executive to maintain free reserves in a range equivalent to three to six month's total expenditure to protect the charity against any sudden reduction in income and ensure immediate commitments can be met, while decisions about the future direction of the charity are made

The trustees are keenly aware of the risks to all services supported by public funding. They are committed to ensure that the charity can continue to meet its core aims and have agreed that reserves should be drawn on, where necessary, to maintain and develop services which are essential to our charitable purpose. In the coming year some funds have been designated to this purpose.

#### **b** Principal funding

Our principal funding sources include contracts with local authorities, health trusts and the Legal Aid Agency (formerly Legal Services Commission) for the provision of separate representation, legal advice, advocacy, independent visitor services, training and mentoring

Other funding sources include the National Assembly of Wales, grant making bodies, individual donors and corporates

- To encourage and support children, young people and vulnerable advocates to express their views directly to policy makers

- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charitable company will continue in operation

### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS for the year ended 31 March 2013

#### 1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### 1.1 BASIS OF PREPARATION OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, with the exception of investments which are included at market value. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP), 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities' published in March 2005, applicable accounting standards and the Companies Act 2006

#### **12 COMPANY STATUS**

The charity is a company limited by guarantee. The members of the company are the Trustees named on page 1. In the event of the charity being wound up, the liability in respect of the guarantee is limited to £1 per member of the charity.

#### 13 FUND ACCOUNTING

General funds are unrestricted funds which are available for use at the discretion of the Trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity and which have not been designated for other purposes

Designated funds comprise unrestricted funds that have been set aside by the Trustees for particular purposes. The aim and use of each designated fund is set out in the notes to the financial statements.

Restricted funds are funds which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by donors or which have been raised by the charity for particular purposes. The costs of raising and administering such funds are charged against the specific fund. The aim and use of each restricted fund is set out in the notes to the financial statements.

Investment income, gains and losses are allocated to the appropriate fund

#### 14 INCOMING RESOURCES

All incoming resources are included in the Statement of financial activities when the charity has entitlement to the funds, certainty of receipt and the amount can be measured with sufficient reliability

Gifts in kind donated for distribution are included at valuation and recognised as income when they are distributed to the projects. Gifts donated for resale are included as income when they are sold. Donated facilities are included at the value to the charity where this can be quantified and a third party is bearing the cost. No amounts are included in the financial statements for services donated by volunteers.

#### 15 RESOURCES EXPENDED

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been included under expense categories that aggregate all costs for allocation to activities. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular activities they have been allocated on a basis consistent with the use of the resources.

Overheads have been allocated on the basis of allocation

#### 16 INVESTMENTS

Investments are stated at market value at the balance sheet date. The Statement of financial activities includes the net gains and losses arising on revaluations and disposals throughout the year.

#### 1.7 TANGIBLE FIXED ASSETS AND DEPRECIATION

The policy with respect to impairment reviews of fixed assets is to review annually for impairment

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost of fixed assets, less their estimated residual value, over their expected useful lives on the following bases.

#### 1.8 OPERATING LEASES

Rentals under operating leases are charged to the Statement of financial activities on a straight line basis over the lease term

#### 1.9 PENSIONS

The charity operates a defined contribution pension scheme and the pension charge represents the amounts payable by the charity to the fund in respect of the year

#### 1 10 INVESTMENT PROPERTIES

Investment properties are included in the Balance sheet at their open market value in accordance with Statement of Standard Accounting Practice No 19 and are not depreciated. This treatment is contrary to the Companies Act 2006 which states that fixed assets should be depreciated but is, in the opinion of the Trustees, necessary in order to give a true and fair view of the financial position of the charity.

#### **Designated Funds**

Funds Designated by the trustees are as follows

#### Legal Service Transitional support

The trustees had designated £400,000 to continue to support the new community care, public law and education services until they were established as self-supporting. Towards the end of the year the viability of the services were reviewed and the Board of Trustees concluded that they were not sustainable in the longer term. A decision was made to close the service from July 2013. A further £200,000 has been set aside to cover the cost for the service for the remaining period and the costs of closure.

#### **Helpline**

The trustees had designated £300,000 to support the NYAS National Advocacy Helpline until other sources of funding were secured. Funding has now been secured from the Big Lottery Fund for three years and the Department of Education for two years, consequently it has not been necessary to designate further funds.

#### Head office relocation

NYAS continues to seek less expensive Head Office accommodation and £80,000 has been designated towards the cost of a possible relocation
