1. Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards (UK GAAP).

The financial statements are presented in US dollars (USD) as this is the functional accounting currency of the group.

Cash Flow Statement

The directors have taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No 1 (Revised 1996) from including a cash flow statement in the financial statements on the grounds that the company is wholly owned and its parent, Trafigura Beheer B.V., publishes a consolidated cash flow statement.

Turnover

Turnover is fees receivable, exclusive of value added tax and represents costs plus 10% mark up.

Fixed Assets

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less a provision for depreciation.

Software development costs are treated as tangible fixed assets, as part of the cost of the related hardware, where they are directly attributable to bringing the hardware into working condition for its intended use within the business.

Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost of an asset, less its estimated residual value, over the useful economic life of that asset as follows:

Leasehold property - 20% p.a. on a straight line basis Fixtures, fittings and computers - 20-40% p.a. on a straight line basis Software Development - 20-40% p.a. on a straight line basis

Operating Lease Agreements

Rentals applicable to operating leases where substantially all of the benefits and risks of ownership remain with the lessor are charged against profits on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.

Pension Costs

The company makes defined contributions to personal pension plans for certain employees. Contributions are charged to the Profit and Loss Account as they become payable.

Deferred Taxation

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date where transactions or events have occurred at that date that will result in an obligation to pay more, or a right to pay less or to receive more tax, with the following exceptions:

1. Accounting Policies (continued)

Provision is made for tax on gains arising from the revaluation (and similar fair value adjustments) of fixed assets, and gains on disposal of fixed assets that have been rolled over into replacement assets, only to the extent that, at the balance sheet date, there is a binding agreement to dispose of the assets concerned. However, no provision is made where, on the basis of all available evidence at the balance sheet date, it is more likely than not that the taxable gain will be rolled over into replacement assets and charged to tax only where the replacement assets are sold.

Deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent that the directors consider that it is more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted.

Deferred tax is measured on an undiscounted basis at the tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which timing differences reverse, based on tax rates and laws enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date.

Foreign Currencies

Transactions in foreign currencies are measured in the functional currency of the Company and are recorded on initial recognition in the functional currency at exchange rates approximating those prevailing at the transaction dates. Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated at the rate of exchange prevailing at the balance sheet date.

Non-monetary items that are measured in terms of historical cost in a foreign currency are translated using the exchange rates as at the dates of the initial transactions. Non-monetary items measured at fair value in a foreign currency are translated using the exchange rates at the date when the fair value was determined.

Exchange differences arising on settlement of monetary items on translating monetary items at the balance sheet date are recognised in the profit and loss account.

2. Turnover

The company's activities consist solely of the provision of services in consultancy, administration and data collection in the United Kingdom.
