BUSINESS AND RESULTS

The results for the year under review show a net profit of £13,407 (1994: Profit £1,744). The company expects to do well and continue to make profits during the years ahead.

PROPOSED DIVIDENDS

The director recommends that no dividend be paid this year and the accumulated loss amounting to £(356) be carried forward.

STATEMENTS OF DIRECTORS' RESPONSIBILITIES

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED

31ST DECEMBER 1995

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

(a) BASIS OF ACCOUNTING

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

(b) CASH FLOW

The accounts do not include a cash flow statement because the company, as a small reporting entity, is exempt from the requirement to prepare such a statement under Financial Reporting Standard 1 'Cash flow Statements'

(c) TURNOVER

Turnover represents net invoiced sales of goods and services, excluding VAT.

(d) TANGIBLE FIXED ASSETS

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life:

Computer Equipment 25% on reducing balance Motor vehicles 25% " "
Office Equipment 25% " "

(e) STOCKS

Stocks and work in progress are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items. Cost includes all direct expenditure and an appropriate proportion of fixed and variable overheads.

(f) DEFERRED TAXATION

Provision is made at current rate for taxation deferred in respect of all material timing differences except to the extent that in the opinion of the directors, there is reasonable probability that the liability will not arise in the foreseeable future

PIP LIFT SERVICE LIMITED NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS - 31ST DECEMBER 1995 (Cont.)

(g) LEASED ASSETS

Rentals applicable to operating leases where substantially all of the benefits and risks of ownership remain with the lessor are charged against profit as incurred.

Assets held under finance leases and hire purchase contracts are capitalised and depreciated over their useful lives. The corresponding lease or hire purchase obligation is treated in the balance sheet as a liability. The interest element of rental obligations is charged to profit and loss account over the period of the lease at a constant proportion of the outstanding balance of capital repayments.

2. TURNOVER

Turnover and profit before taxation are attributable to the principal activity of the company.
