The Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 July 2014

The Trustees are pleased to present their annual report and accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 July 2014, which have been prepared in accordance with the Companies Act 2006 and comply with SORP – "Accounting for Charities".

Legal and Administrative

Legal and administrative information set out on page 1 forms part of this report.

- Kogan Academy of Dramatic Arts is a company limited by guarantee under registration number 2746484, and is a registered charity under registration number 1014419.
- A Trustee can be appointed by a resolution passed by the existing Board of Trustees Names of Trustees, Registered office and details of advisors are provided on page 1
- The Principal has power under the School's constitutional documents to invest School funds in the manner she deems fit
- The Academy is governed by Articles of Association and Memorandum of Association

Objectives

The objects of the School are:

- (i) to advance the education of the public in particular by teaching scientifically based methods of acting and stage, television and film directing;
- (ii) to advance the education of young people in the arts especially the dramatic arts in particular through the promotion of workshops and other educational training programmes in schools and other educational establishments including institutions for the mentally handicapped.

Review of Activities and Financial Position

Following the accreditation of the Three Year Full Time Acting Course by Kingston University (London), Kogan Academy has promoted the course as a BA (Hons) in Acting. As the year progressed further approaches were made which have resulted in approval by the <u>Quality Assurance Agency for Higher Education (QAA)</u>, <u>Higher Education Funding Council for England (HEFCE)</u> and Department for Business Innovation & Skills (BIS). This should lead to appropriate students being able to apply to the Student Loan Company (SLC) for funding.

Despite continued financial pressures the Academy has sought to maintain a strong and proactive marketing focus. Advertising in the UK, Sweden and Iceland has continued to reflect the student base that we have from those countries. We have also sought to raise the Academy's profile in other EU countries as well. Advertising at a local level in north London and the greater London area stimulates interest. Applicants for courses have also been evident from those who have read "The Science of Acting" by Sam Kogan and edited by Helen Kogan.

Auditions were held in London throughout the year and in Stockholm in December 2013, February, April, June and July 2014 and also Amsterdam in July.

The Academy continued to hold Open Days throughout the year. Holding Open Days has proved a popular and useful way of giving a very tangible insight into the school's approach for prospective students. The events are now held on a Saturday with some auditions taking place in the afternoon for those who are prepared.

Theatre visits continued throughout the year as an extracurricular activity arranged for all students. This included a visit to the Old Vic to see "The Crucible" and Regents Park Theatre to see "All My Sons".

Kogan Academy's graduation showcase was performed at the "Soho Downstairs" Theatre on 29th May 2014. The cabaret style venue at the Soho Theatre proved again to be an excellent venue for agents and graduates' guests to mingle with Academy staff and students

Tutors from Kogan Academy directed several plays again this year. Katy Dower directed 1st Year Students in a performance of Bob Larbey's "A Small Affair". Paul Mushumani directed "Music Lessons" by Ludmila Petrushevskaya with the 2nd Years and Thomas Garvey directed the 3rd Year students in Ena Lamont Stewart's "Men Should Weep".

Outside Director Mike Sherman directed the Third Year Students in a production of "Scarlett Pimpernel".

Graduating Directors also put on a number of performances in the year including Mira Pranger directing "Brighton Beach Memoirs" by Neil Simon, Emma Frisk directing "Crimes of the Heart" by Beth Henley, Vala Fannell directing "Remembrance" by Graham Reid, Sindri Olafsson directing "Steel Magnolias" by Robert Harling and Ylva Hansson directing "The Memory of Water" by Shelagh Stephenson.

Graduates of Kogan Academy continued to succeed in the industry in this year. Philip Bulcock provided voice overs in the animation "Fairy and the Fly", Audrey Sheffield continued to direct including "Almost Near" by Pamela Carter at the Finborough Theatre and Andrew Byron appeared in "Taken: The Search for Sophie Parker" a TV film. Several recent graduates have become involved in acting and directing roles in film and theatre in the UK, Sweden, Iceland and Denmark.

From 16th August to 24th August 2013 students performed "Once Upon a Time". There were 8 separate performances of "Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs", "Trip, Trapp, Trull and the Giant" and "The Frog Prince" playing to packed audiences of children and adults. There was again financial support provided by the Islington Local Initiatives Fund. The attendance of many families with young children and local playgroups and nurseries made a great basis of outreach into the community.

This has also worked to raise the interest in the re-launched Childrens Classes run on Saturdays by students which has proved to be a positive experience for all those involved.

On 14th December 2013 the students performed a Christmas concert to a variety of staff, graduates and guests. There were seasonal songs and other musical numbers followed by a social event.

Trustee meetings are held on a regular basis and as required by the management of the school. Similarly the Education Committee meets regularly and as necessary to discuss academic issues that require discussion and/or group input. The School continues to be efficiently managed with minimum wastage of administrative resources and expedient use of staff time.

The Academy has continued to develop and transform and its relationship with Kingston University and other professional bodies becoming vital in the long term success of the "Science of Acting" and the students who continue to pursue a career in acting.

Notes to the Accounts for the year ended 31 July 2014

Accounting policies

Basis of preparation of the accounts

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (FRSSE), effective June 2008, and all other applicable accounting standards, as modified by the Statement of Recommended Practice for Accounting and Reporting issued by the Charity Commissioners for England and Wales, effective (SORP 2005). The accounts have been drawn up in accordance with the provisions of the Charities Act and the Companies Act.

The company has taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No I from the requirement to produce a cash flow statement.

The particular accounting policies adopted are set out below.

Accounting convention

The financial statements are prepared, on a going concern basis, under the historical cost convention.

Incoming Resources

Incoming resources are accounted for on an accruals basis.

Recognition of liabilities

Liabilities are recognised on the accruals basis in accordance with normal accounting Principles, modified where necessary in accordance with the guidance given in the Statement of Recommended Practice for Accounting and Reporting issued by the Charity Commissioners for England & Wales.

Charitable expenditure

Charitable expenditure includes all expenditure directly related to the objects of the charity and comprise of the following:-

Activities in furtherance of the charity's objectives

The costs of activities in furtherance of the charity's objectives represents the cost of goods and services and ancillary trading costs that have been incurred in charitable activities.

Support costs of activities

Support costs of activities for charitable purposes comprises the salary costs of the Manager. There are a number of costs, including staffing costs, where it is impracticable to allocate these costs between administration and charitable expenditure and the trustees have allocated such costs to management and administration costs.

Notes to the Accounts for the year ended 31 July 2014

Management and administration of the charity

Management and administration costs represent expenditure incurred in the management of the charity's assets, organisational administration and compliance with charitable and statutory requirements.

Allocation of costs within types of resources expended

The Charity's operating costs include staff costs, rent and related costs. Such costs are allocated between types of resources expended and between charitable expenditure and management and administration on the basis of estimates made by the directors.

Administration expenditure includes all expenditure not directly related to charitable activity. In respect of certain items of expenditure it is a matter of judgement as to whether such items are direct charitable expenditure or are administrative, and the directors have applied what they consider to be reasonable judgements in apportioning such costs.

Fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Items of less than £200 are not capitalised. Depreciation has been provided at the following rates in order to write off the assets (less their expected residual value) over their estimated useful economic lives.

A regular annual review of the likelihood of asset impairment is undertaken.

Taxation

As a registered charity, the company is exempt from income and corporation tax to the extent that its income and gains are applicable to charitable purposes only. Value Added Tax is not recoverable by the company, and is therefore included in the relevant costs in the Statement of Financial Activities.

Finance and operating leases

Rentals payable in respect of operating leases where substantially all the benefits and risks of ownership remain with lessor are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities as incurred.

Notes to the Accounts for the Year ended 31 July 2014

1) Funds Structure Policy

The Charity maintains a general unrestricted fund which represents funds which are expendable at the discretion of the trusteees in furtherance of the objects of the charity. Such funds may be held in order to finance both working capital and capital investment.

No restricted funds have been provided to the charity for any particular purposes

There is no formal policy on the allocation of funds to designated funds.

There is no formal policy of transfer between funds. Any proposed transfer between funds would be considered on the particular circumstances.

2) Winding up or Dissolution of the Charity

If upon winding up or dissolution of the charity there remain any asets, after the satisfaction of all debts and liabilities, the assets represented by the accumulated fund shall be transferred to some other charitable body or bodies having similar objects to the charity.
