Report of the directors for the year ended 31 March 2002

The directors present their report and the audited financial statements of the company for the year ended 31 March 2002.

Review of the business

The principal activity of the company is that of an investment holding company.

Both the level of business and year end financial position were satisfactory, and the directors expect that the present level of activity will be sustained for the foreseeable future.

On 1 April 2001, LI Holdings (UK) Limited (since renamed LI Holdings (UK) plc) acquired the entire issued share capital of the company.

Results and dividends

The profit on ordinary activities after taxation amounted to £4,910,000 (2001: £nil). An interim dividend of £1,883,000 was paid during the year and the directors recommend the payment of a final dividend of £1,410,000. The retained profit for the financial year amounted to £1,617,000 (2001: £nil) which has been transferred to reserves.

Directors' responsibilities

1 Principal accounting policies

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards in the United Kingdom.

12 Contingencies

An unlimited composite banking guarantee exists between the company and certain subsidiary companies and various fellow group undertakings in respect of banking facilities provided to the group in the UK.

The company, together with certain subsidiary undertakings and various fellow group undertakings, has provided a UK guarantee for the financing obligations of Carlisle Finance (Iceland) ltd., a fellow group undertaking incorporated in Iceland. The guarantee provides a first priority lien on the share capital of each guarantor and on certain other property and assets, including receivables, of each guarantor.

13 Ultimate parent undertaking

The company's immediate parent undertaking is LI Holdings (UK) plc.

As at 31 March 2002, the smallest group in which the company is consolidated was LI Holdings (UK) plc, a company incorporated in Great Britain and registered in England and Wales. Copies of the consolidated financial statements of LI Holdings (UK) plc can be obtained from its registered office at St Florian House, Milton Road, Wokingham, Berkshire RG40 1EN.

As at 31 March 2002, the company's ultimate parent undertaking was Carlisle Holdings Limited, a company registered in Belize. Lord Ashcroft beneficially owned and controlled 68.5 percent of Carlisle Holdings Limited.
