### 1 Principal accounting policies

#### **Basis of accounting**

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards in the United Kingdom and the provisions of the Companies Act 1985.

### 12 Ultimate parent undertaking

As at 31 March 2005, the smallest group in which the company is consolidated was Carlisle Cleaning Services Holdings (UK) plc, a company incorporated in Great Britain and registered in England and Wales. Copies of the consolidated financial statements of Carlisle Cleaning Services Holdings (UK) plc can be obtained from its registered office at St Florian House, Milton Road, Wokingham, Berkshire RG40 1EN.

As at 31 March 2005, the company's ultimate parent undertaking was Carlisle Holdings Limited, a company registered in Belize. Lord Ashcroft, KCMG beneficially owned and controlled 70.5 percent of Carlisle Holdings Limited.
